RESIDENT ASSISTANCE FUND

Our confidential Resident Assistance Fund supports residents in our community who, through no fault of their own, have depleted their assets and are unable to meet their monthly expenses. With the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation's support, no resident has ever been asked to leave due to an inability to pay.

Since 2011, the Resident Assistance Fund has provided more than \$3 million in resident support.

WILMA'S STORY

Wilma's earliest memories of growing up in Kansas during the Great Depression were of the Dust Bowl. "My mom remembered putting wet towels under the doors and windows so the house wouldn't fill with the silt that was blowing around," says her daughter Dianne. After World War II, Wilma met her husband, Henry, who was 14 years older and from her hometown, "a very Mayberry small town." There, they raised three children until Henry, a banker, died of heart failure, leaving Wilma a widow at 70. She loved her home, but when she began to show signs of Alzheimer's, Dianne brought her to live with her in McLean.

As the dementia progressed, Dianne knew she needed to find a safer place for her mother. After recuperating from a broken hip, Wilma moved into The Sylvestery at Vinson Hall in 2016. With her radiant smile and love of people, she took to her new home immediately.

Over time, Wilma's long-term care policy was spent down and her savings dwindled. "My parents had built their assets during their lives – it's not that they didn't plan. They just didn't plan on dementia and having to leave their small town," says Dianne. When Wilma's resources neared depletion, the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation stepped in to offer help through the Resident Assistance Fund. Wilma was able to remain in her home until her passing last year.

EMPLOYEE CARING FUND

Launched at the start of the pandemic in 2020, the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation's Employee Caring Fund supports Vinson Hall's team of 300 dedicated staff when they face financial hardships, seek coursework or citizenship, or merit a special circumstance bonus. As our residents will be the first to tell you, this team contributes so much to making Vinson Hall the special place that it is. Our goal is to ensure that they feel valued and supported.

More than \$573,000 has been granted to staff through the Employee Caring Fund since 2020, a total of 1,255 financial awards.

HILDA'S STORY

Hilda was only nine when she left Guatemala and moved to Washington, D.C. "My father came to escape the rebels in Guatemala," says Hilda, who spoke no English but quickly learned in school. For most of her adult life, she has worked in housekeeping. In 2020 during the height of the pandemic, she was hired as a housekeeping supervisor at Vinson Hall. "My priority has always been to keep the residents safe, and to make sure they have a smile and are satisfied with what we do." Today, as Housekeeping Manager, she supervises 26 housekeepers and five porters, a job she loves. "At Vinson Hall, everybody is friendly. It is like family."

One night in 2022, Hilda woke up with fever, chills and extreme pain. "My husband rushed me to the hospital. Come to find out, I had kidney stones, and one had gotten stuck in the tube." The emergency surgery was successful, but her recuperation took six weeks, and she had to take several weeks off without pay. "I got behind in my bills, and they were about to cut off my water and electricity."

That is when she applied for and received assistance from the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation's Employee Caring Fund. Then last year, after suffering another bout of kidney stones, this time in her other kidney, the Employee Caring Fund was able to step in again. The Fund paid for three medical bills not covered by insurance.

INNOVATION AND ENHANCEMENT FUND

Through the Innovation & Enhancement Fund, the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation seeks to deliver innovative technology and other enhancements to the residents of Vinson Hall. In recent years, this Fund has provided a host of creative enhancements to our community, including a sound system for Alford Auditorium, portable speakers and microphones, a resident portal, and a digital kiosk.

WARRIOR TRANSITION FUND

In celebration of Vinson Hall's rich military heritage, the Warrior Transition Fund allows our residents to connect to and support young warriors by offering temporary housing at no cost to wounded service members. The Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation sets aside two apartments in Vinson Hall to house injured or ill sailors as they transition to the next chapter in their lives. This Fund was established in 2013, and to our knowledge there is no other program quite like it in the nation.



"When I found out I had been selected to be a part of Vinson Hall's warrior program, I thought: 'I get to hear all these stories from different people about their lives – they're going to be amazing!'"

Since 2013, the Warrior Transition Fund has provided 25 wounded warriors with a home at Vinson Hall while they recuperated.

KAYLA'S STORY

Kayla thought she had her life all planned out at age 18 when she joined the Navy and became a radar technician in 2017. "I loved my job! I was ready to do the full 20 years in the Navy," she says. But while serving on board a destroyer, she had two unfortunate accidents. When she and another sailor were carrying a 100-lb box of supply parts down a steep ladder, he lost his grip and the box hit Kayla, knocking her down and injuring her knees and head. A month later, a second shipboard fall re-injured her knees and back.

In early 2024, Kayla moved in to Vinson Hall, sponsored by the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation's Warrior Transition Fund, after seven surgeries at Walter Reed in two years. She was in a wheelchair with knee braces, but that didn't keep her down. After getting involved in adaptive athletics, Kayla competed in the Warrior Games and Invictus Games – chalking up gold medal wins for Wheelchair Basketball, Rugby, Shotput and Discus. She was also named the Navy's 2024 Wounded Warrior of the Year.

With her ready smile and buoyant nature, Kayla, 26, instantly won the hearts of our residents. Family is very important to the Arizona native, and family is what she has found at Vinson Hall. "I love it here – it's like I have a hundred grandparents!" With their encouragement and guidance, Kayla's post-Navy plans now include college. She was recently accepted to the University of Missouri and plans to attend next year on an athletic scholarship.

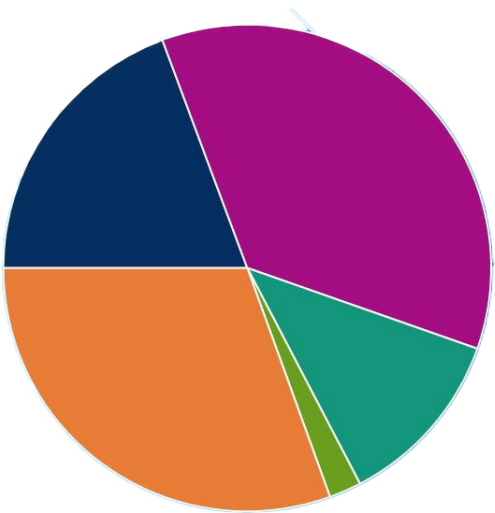

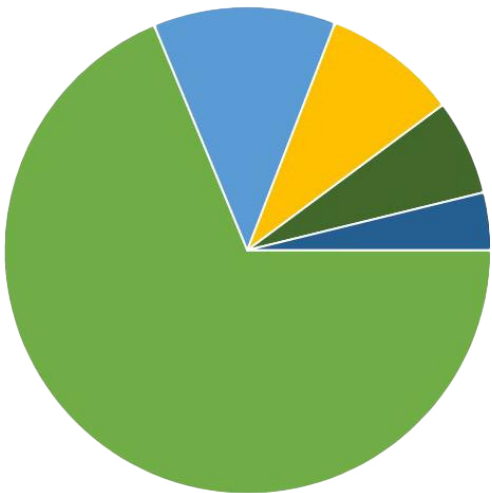

JACK AND LORRAINE'S STORY

Jack Hannon served as a Navy Air Intelligence Officer during the Vietnam War, and while stationed in California met Lorraine, a dietitian at a hospital. The couple married during Jack's law school years, and moved to McLean for the start of his law career at COMSAT, where he stayed for 28 years. The Hannons raised their family in McLean, and when it came time for retirement they chose Vinson Hall down the road. "We've lived in McLean more than 50 years, and at Vinson Hall for more than a decade – this is our home now," says Jack.

The Hannons made a planned gift to the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation in the form of an IRA devoted to charity that sits alongside an IRA for their children. Having led the planned giving program at St. Johns Episcopal Church in McLean for decades, Jack understands the importance of planned giving. "A planned gift is a way to give that doesn't change your cash flow, but is going to do a lot of good for whatever entity you designate."

The Hannons hope that their gift, added to many others, will help ensure that Vinson Hall has adequate resources to weather the storms that may arise in the future. He points out the massive changes he's seen in McLean in the last half century. "Who knows what Vinson Hall will be encountering 50 years from now? We just want to see a good thing continue long into the future."
