Riding Lessons


We cater to both Western and English disciplines, whether it's jumping, dressage, polocrosse, campdrafting, or the Stockman's challenges, our skilled instructors specialise in a variety of areas to meet every equestrian's needs.

Structure

Each lesson at Hindle Horsemanship is designed to balance horsemanship skills with time in the saddle. In a one-hour lesson, students begin with around 10 minutes of grooming and tacking up under the guidance of their instructor, before spending approximately 45 minutes riding. The session concludes with a five-minute cool-down, where riders untack and ensure their horse is comfortable.

Thirty-minute lessons follow a similar structure but in a shorter format, with about five minutes spent grooming and preparing the horse, 20 minutes of focused riding, and a brief cool-down and untacking to finish.

As part of our ethos, we believe grooming and groundwork are just as important as riding, helping students build a stronger bond with their horse while learning responsibility, respect, and care. Both lesson formats promote riding skills, responsibility, and a deeper understanding of horsemanship, giving students a well-rounded equestrian education.





DISCIPLINES ON OFFER

Hindle Horsemanship offers a well-rounded horsemanship education, with training across disciplines like Campdrafting, Dressage, Mounted Games, Working Equitation, and more, ensuring riders develop versatile skills and confidence in every arena.

Working Equitation



equitation Working combines precision control, focusing on and dressage obstacles. Riders work on technical precision and mastering transitions, preparing them to compete in all phases of this multi-discipline sport.

Campdrafting



Students practice using a mechanical cow to develop control and precision for future work with live cattle. This builds the timing, positioning, and confidence needed to eventually compete in campdrafting competitions.

Jumping




For jumping enthusiasts, our lessons emphasise the fundamentals of safe and balanced jumping, with a focus on posture and timing. As students progress, they develop the confidence and technique needed to handle courses with a variety of jumps.

Stockman's Challenge



Students learn to manage obstacles and cattle work, fundamental for stockman's challenges. By focusing on versatility and control, they prepare for the multi-discipline nature of this event, honing skills that replicate real-world tasks.

Gymkhana & Mounted Games



Gymkhana and Mounted Games focus on balance, precision, and quick reactions. Students gain confidence through fun, fastpaced challenges that sharpen coordination, control, and partnership with their horse.

Dressage



We provide students with a solid base balance, rhythm, and connection, which is dressage. As they advance, they begin to understand more complex movements, progressing through dressage levels with ease and precision.

At Hindle Horsemanship, our instructors are not only actively competing in their chosen fields but also continuously expanding their skills to bring the latest techniques and insights to our students.

In addition to the main disciplines, we offer training in gymkhana, mounted games, and carriage driving. This ensures that every rider has the opportunity to grow, explore new areas of interest, and thrive in a wide variety of equestrian sports.

Vaulting Lessons

Our vaulting lessons are designed to help riders enhance their core strength, balance, and coordination while developing a more independent seat. Riders are bareback with a vaulting roller, focusing on their posture and control, as their instructor handles the horse on a lunge lead. Depending on experience, vaulting can be done at a walk, trot, or canter, with advanced students trying basic gymnastics movements. These one-on-one lessons are fantastic for building confidence and refinement of the rider's aids, as they learn to rely less on reins and stirrups for balance and communication.



Groundwork Lessons

At Hindle Horsemanship, our groundwork lessons focus on developing trust, communication, and a solid understanding between horse and rider. For beginners, we teach essential skills such as how to lunge a horse correctly, how to lead a horse with safety and awareness, and loading horses into a truck with confidence.

As riders progress, we introduce more advanced techniques like flexing a horse from the ground, and mastering control of the horse's shoulders and hindquarters independently. These lessons form the core foundation for riding success, improving responsiveness and the overall partnership with the horse.

Liberty Lessons

Liberty lessons at Hindle Horsemanship are designed to help students connect with their horses in a more profound and intuitive way. Conducted in a round yard with the horse completely free, these lessons emphasize communication through body language and energy. Students learn to analyze and understand the horse's natural signals, responding to subtle cues. The focus is on building trust and respect between horse and rider without physical restraints, enabling a deeper bond. This method also strengthens horsemanship skills, increasing the rider's ability to influence the horse naturally and without force.

Long-Reining Lessons

Our long-reining lessons help riders refine their rein control, allowing them to develop a deeper understanding of how to communicate with their horse through reins and voice aids. By working from the ground, students can focus on these skills without the added complexity of riding, building coordination and confidence. Long-reining is also an excellent stepping stone for those interested in carriage driving, providing a strong foundation in handling horses and mastering rein use in preparation for driving. It also enhances a horse's responsiveness and balance, benefiting riders in any discipline.

Carriage Driving Lessons

Carriage driving lessons at Hindle Horsemanship provide a unique and rewarding way for students to connect with horses. With an emphasis on control, communication, and teamwork, students learn how to guide both horse and cart safely. These lessons are designed to improve coordination and confidence as students develop their rein-handling skills. For those interested in advancing their knowledge of horsemanship or exploring new ways to work with horses, carriage driving offers a fresh and enjoyable challenge.

They must be booked together, whether with friends or as part of a school program, and riders cannot be added into existing groups. Schools, such as Fairholme College, often organise regular weekly sessions during the school term. To maintain high-quality coaching, individual attention, and a safe learning environment, each group is limited to a maximum of four participants.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I pay?

- Payments can be made easily through the Fresha booking app.
- Cash is accepted on the day of the lesson.
- If an invoice is sent for a lesson pack, payment can be made via bank transfer.
- Lesson packs are to be paid for upfront before commencing the first lesson.



What are the next steps?

What do I wear?

Enclosed shoes with a heel (like boots), preferably with a smooth sole, comfortable pants, and a fitted shirt. Helmets are provided if you don't have your own.

What if I am a complete beginner?

That's absolutely fine! Many of our riders start with no previous experience. Our instructors will guide you step by step, beginning with the basics of horse safety, grooming, tacking up, and mounting. You'll learn how to communicate with your horse on the ground before moving into the saddle, so you feel confident and supported. Lessons are paced at your comfort level, and our school horses are specially chosen for their safe and reliable temperaments, making them perfect partners for new riders.

I'm thinking about buying my first horse — where do I start?

We're here to help! Our team can guide you through the horse-purchasing process, and we sometimes have horses for sale on behalf of clients, making it easier to find the right match. If you choose to agist at Hindle Horsemanship, we'll continue to support you as a new horse owner. We're always happy to share advice, answer questions, and make the journey less overwhelming.

What is your cancellation policy?

We understand that plans can change, but to keep things fair for everyone:

- Lessons cancelled with more than 24 hours' notice can be rescheduled at no cost.
- Lessons cancelled within 24 hours will be forfeited.
- If you are signed up for a **group lesson over the school term**, and one person cannot make it, that lesson is forfeited (group lessons cannot be rescheduled individually).
- Private lessons are more flexible—if you need to reschedule, just give us at least 24 hours' notice.
- Lesson pack purchases paid upfront and are intended to be used once per week. If you
 need to reschedule one of these lessons, please complete the make-up lesson in the
 following week.
- In the rare case we need to cancel due to weather or unforeseen circumstances, you'll be contacted promptly and offered a reschedule or credit.
