## 1. Objectives

ECIU University set out to bring the ECTS Information Packages of all the partners in the alliance into a single ECIU University information package. The result aimed for is the existence of a single platform where students can search a database of courses and course units that adhere to the ECTS key features, and specific information for mobile students in terms of access to courses within and from outside the ECIU University alliance.

## 2. Achievements

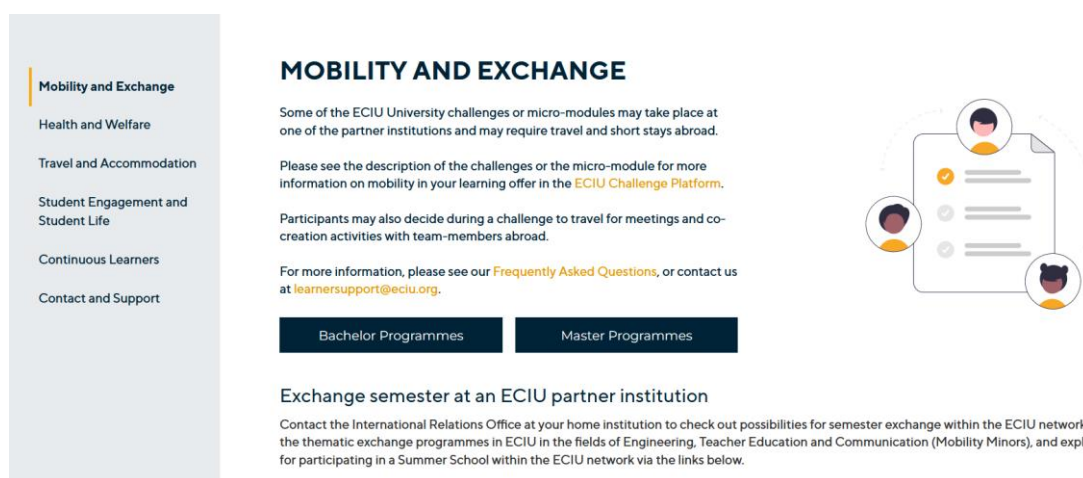
Several coinciding activities that have been developed in the ECIU University Pilot Project and towards the development of the next phase of ECIU University have been brought heavily to bear on the work that the WP6 Mobility team. These include in particular the decision of ECIU University to develop the DxP experience platform for users, focusing on the broader learner's journey (including continuous learners) and not the mobility journey. At EU level, there have been developments at the level of the European Student Card Initiative, and the recent relaunch of the Erasmus+ App with new features, including complementing the mobility journey with HEI specific information (ELTE). Given that these 2 major movements are currently taking place, it seemed appropriate for ECIU to focus its efforts on guaranteeing improved information services to students through its Learners Service Centre, linking this to the Student Travel Website under Output 6.1\_02.

To this end, in collaboration with WP7 (Joint Structures) and WP9 (Dissemination) all of the information for candidates and participants is brought together in a single space, including the following features:

- Links to the Bachelor and Master degree **course catalogues** of every ECIU Member University (Fig. 1 Screenshot of Information for Mobile Students)
- Health and Welfare
- Travel and Accommodation
- Student Engagement
- Information for lifelong learners
- Support services for mobile students

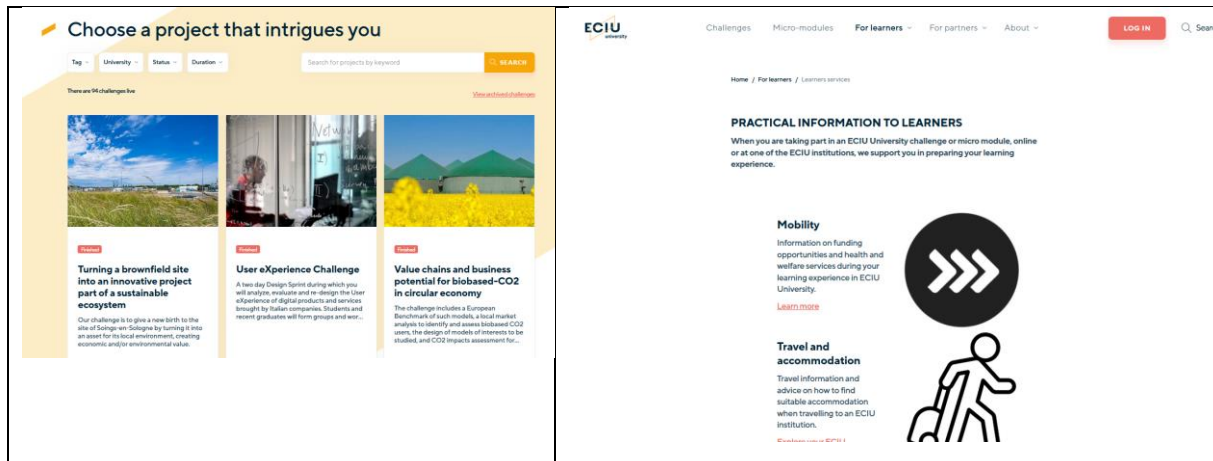


## The ECIU University
