ECIU Team Award – criteria 2020

1. Project Description (max 200 words; 2 points)

Please describe the goal(s) of your innovation project and the general set-up (eg what, how).

2. Transformative Aspect (max 250 words; 4 points)

Please explain what impact changing your education (including an online format as well) had for whom, and indicate why it was transformative for whom (teachers, students, discipline) and on what scale. If possible, please include (preliminary) results on this transformative aspect and/or refer to scientific theories and research to support your claims.

3. Long term application and replicability (max 200 words; 4 points)

Please explain how you will use (part of) the current set up of your (online) education in the future, why this part and why in this way. Please also explain whether and to what extent, in your view, some innovative aspects could be replicated in different types of programmes and teaching activities, regardless the subject-area or the programme-level (graduate, undergraduate).

4. Team working on the innovation (max 150 words, 3 points)

Please explain the composition of the team that worked on this innovation (both in the design, implementation, execution and evaluation of the innovation), and indicate what role each partner had. Especially a team consisting of people from multiple disciplines, different departments or even different organizations is appreciated, as well as teams that include students in the design of innovation.

5. Students as Partners (max 150 words; 3 points)

Please explain how students as active participants/change agents were involved in your innovation (in the design, implementation, execution and/or evaluation of the innovation).

6. Enhances student learning (max 250 words; 4 points)

Please explain how your innovation is enhancing the learning of the student, e.g. students learn more content, depth of learning increases, self-directedness of the student is improved etc. Again, if possible please substantiate your claim with reference to results and/or scientific literature.

Supporting materials

Please include links to (part of) your (online) education as an example. Please specify what can be seen, and if you refer to part of a video(lecture), indicate what timeslot the committee should look at. Please consider that the evaluation commission will not be able to watch extensive video materials; 10 total minutes could be a fair approximation of maximum duration of materials that the evaluation commission could consider.
