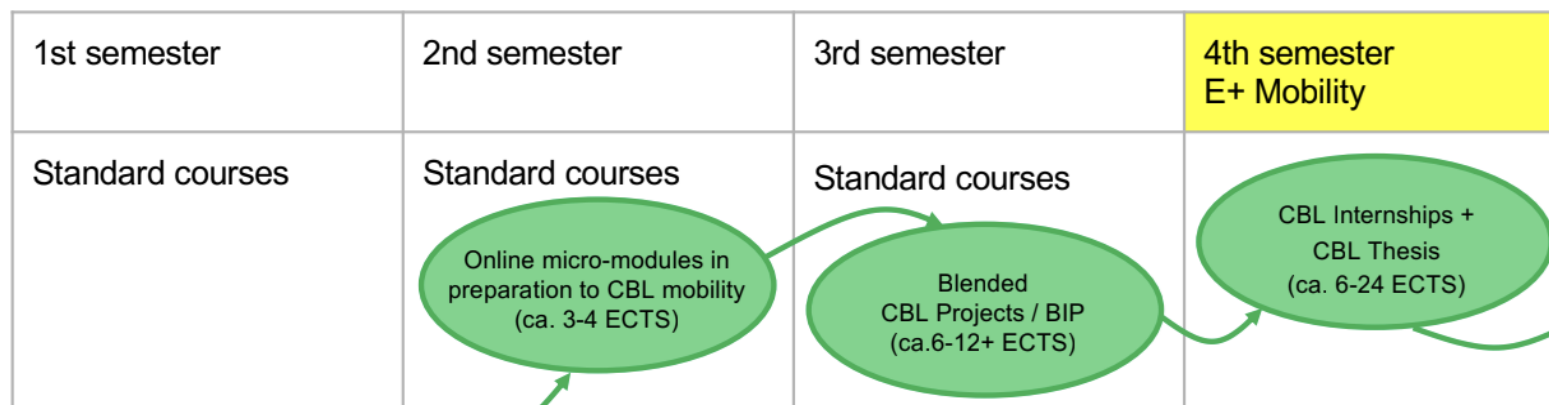
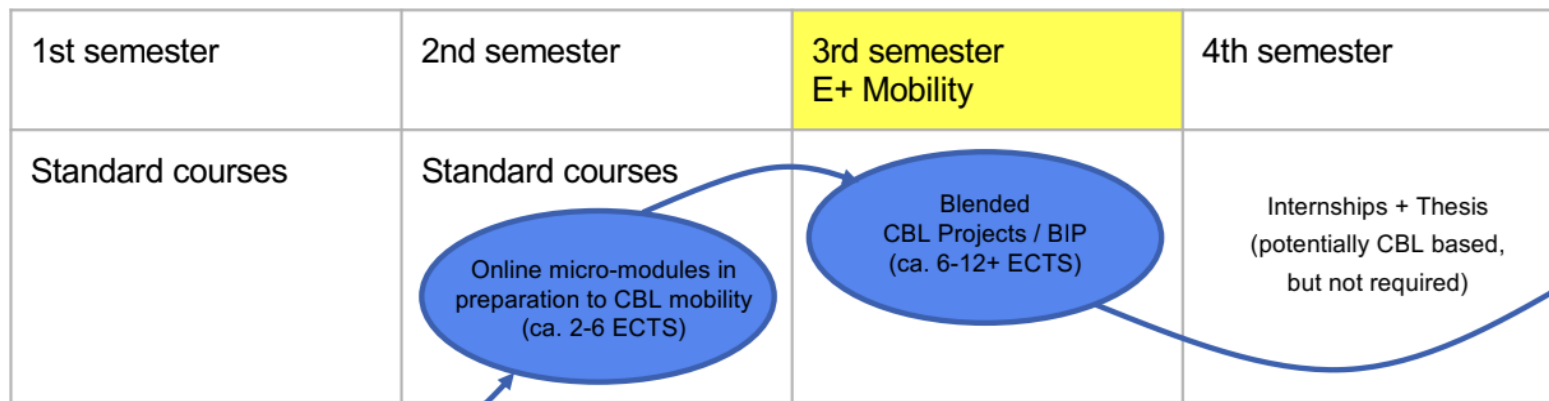

## What we want to explore in JUMP ?

- JUMPing between islands of micro- and challenge modules  
- a new way of offering learning opportunities abroad?
- Through an innovative mobility scheme (called Challenge-Based Learning Minor), JUMP will enhance students' responsible innovation and entrepreneurial (I&E) skills
- The CBL Minor comprises online micro-modules, blended challenge projects, internships, and theses. It advocates for a structured European approach and leverages existing programs to scale this initiative.
