We are pleased to provide you with the thirteenth newsletter for the MVP Southgate project as part of our effort to maintain communication with stakeholders throughout the regulatory process.

About MVP Southgate

The MVP Southgate project is a proposed interstate natural gas pipeline that will safely and efficiently transport natural gas from the existing Mountain Valley Pipeline terminus near Chatham, Virginia, via an underground 30-inch diameter pipe to delivery points in Rockingham County, North Carolina. The project will help satisfy growing energy demand in the Southeastern United States, ensuring diversified access to affordable, low emissions natural gas, and supporting reliable energy delivery to residents and businesses.

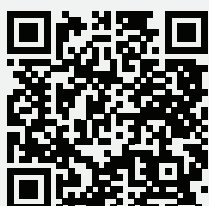
As an interstate pipeline project, MVP Southgate is governed by the federal Natural Gas Act and regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). Mountain Valley Pipeline, LLC, a joint venture led by EQT Corporation and NextEra Energy, will construct and own the proposed MVP Southgate.

The Latest

In March, MVP Southgate received all necessary permits and authorizations to start construction in Virginia and began project work. In June, after the project received all necessary permits and authorizations for construction to start in North Carolina, crews began work in Rockingham County. Work is now under way at various points across the MVP Southgate project's 31-mile length in Virginia and North Carolina.

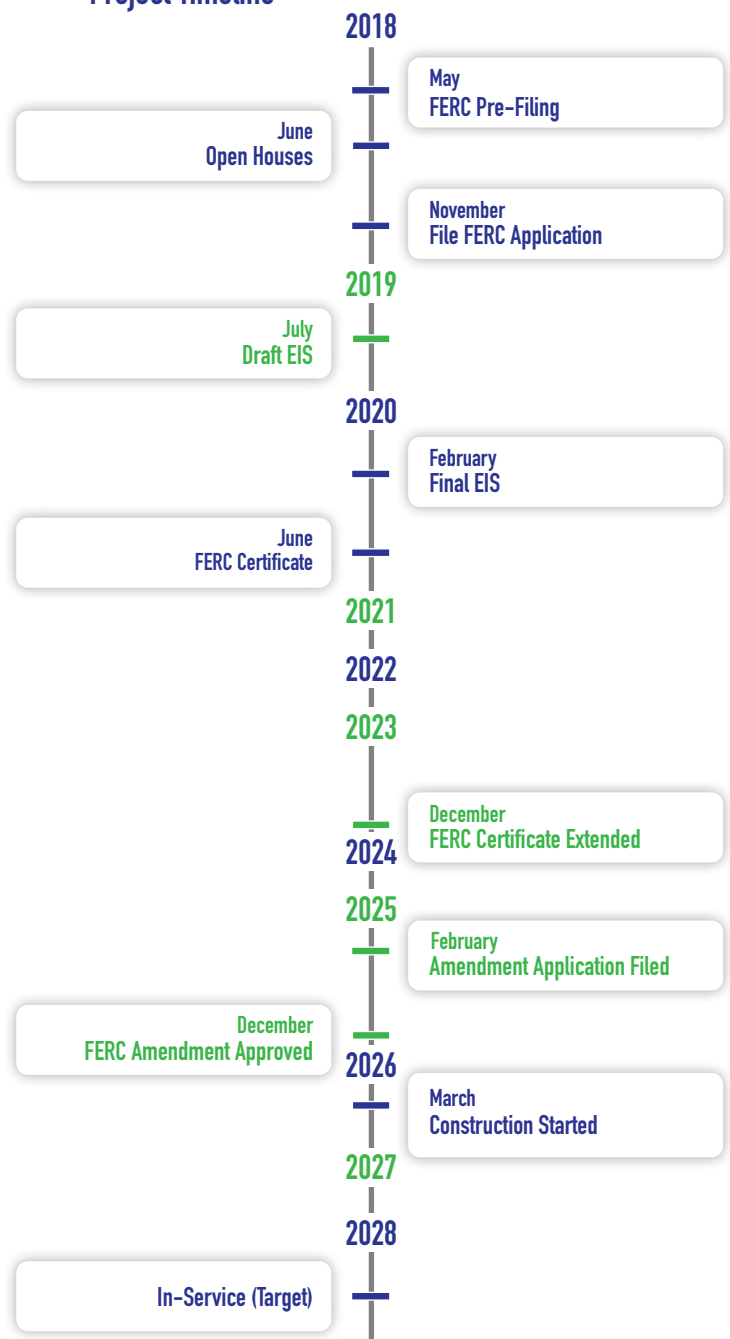
Mountain Valley is committed to working collaboratively with affected landowners to minimize any inconvenience associated with construction of this important energy infrastructure project.

Crew members prepare to start work on the MVP Southgate project. Construction activities began on the Virginia portion of the project route in March and on the North Carolina portion in June.

The Positive Economic Impacts of MVP Southgate

Construction and operation of MVP Southgate will deliver substantial economic benefits throughout the region. During construction, according to an analysis by FTI Consulting, the project is expected to:

- Support nearly 1,000 jobs in Virginia and North Carolina.
- Provide average pay of \$64,400.
- Generate more than \$10 million in state and local tax revenue.

The North Carolina Utilities Commission has recognized the need for an additional interstate natural gas supply, and the MVP Southgate project is designed to meet that need by bringing 550 million cubic feet of natural gas per day directly into the state. Duke and PSNC Energy have signed binding, long-term agreements for the natural gas that MVP Southgate will transport.

MVP Southgate is targeted to enter service in 2028, providing the region with critically important access to additional supplies of affordable, reliable and lower-carbon natural gas for homes, businesses and electricity generation.

New MVP Scholarship Available at Rockingham Community College

Wentworth, NC – A new scholarship funded by Mountain Valley Pipeline will be available in the 2026-27 school year to benefit a Rockingham County student enrolled at Rockingham Community College (RCC).

The MVP Scholarship will provide financial assistance to a qualifying full-time student to be selected by the RCC Financial Aid Office under terms of the scholarship. The MVP Scholarship at RCC builds on Mountain Valley's ongoing efforts to support local educational opportunities, including:

- A similar scholarship at Danville Community College (DCC),
- Contributions of large diameter pipe to the DCC and RCC welding programs, and
- Funding for the Eden Chamber of Commerce Foundation's scholarships for graduating Morehead High School seniors.

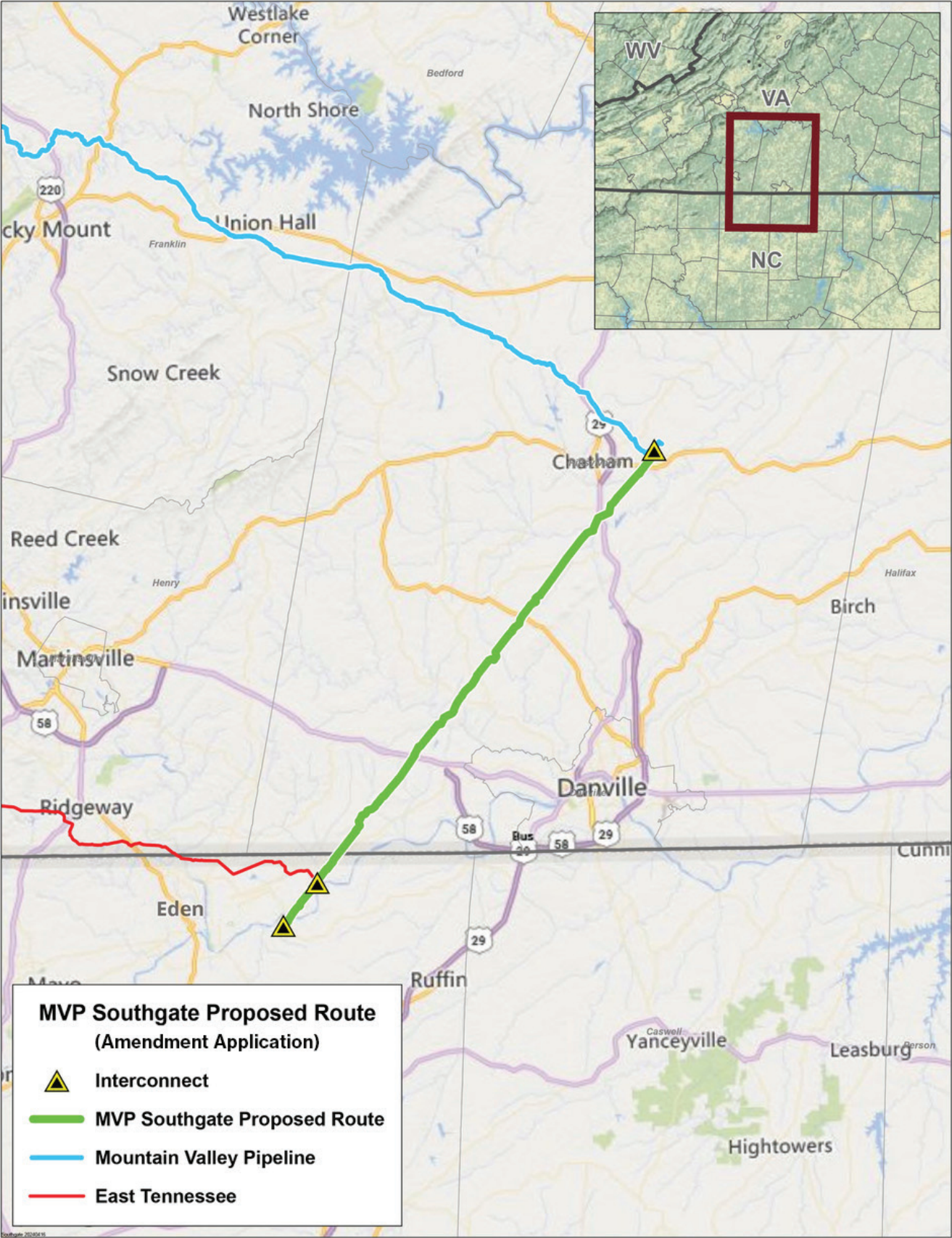
