



### Contribute to the new Fair Go Report 2025 for Australians

Australians are feeling the pressure of financial uncertainty; housing affordability has reached crisis level, living costs are rising, and stress is growing. In this moment, the **WeMoney Financial Wellness Summit 2025** brings together the hearts and minds that can make a difference to draft a vision to solve these challenges.

Across a full day of panels, workshops, and open discussions, leaders from finance, policy, and behavioural science will explore new ways to help Australians build lasting financial wellbeing.

At the centre of the Summit is the **Fair Go Report 2025** — A national policy and action blueprint for improving Australians' financial wellbeing. Previous editions, such as the 2022-2023 Financial Wellness Report in collaboration with Ubank directly informed submissions to the Treasury on **Consumer Data Right** reforms in 2021 and 2024.

Their findings were featured across major outlets including Channel 7 News, helping to shape public debate around financial resilience and consumer protection.

Building on that impact, the 2025 Summit focuses on turning insight into action. Solutions to the problems at hand will be discussed through keynotes, panels, and interactive Q&A's. Each solution will be documented, refined, and published within the **Fair Go Report 2025**, ensuring that every idea generated on the day contributes to a roadmap for measurable change — one that policymakers, industry, and community groups can act on.


