1. Human Medications

NSAIDs
(eg. Aspirin, Ibuprofen) Tylenol

Vomiting Labored Breathing
Diarrhea Vomiting
Weakness Liver Damage
Incoordination Coma
Intestinal Hemorrhage Death
Collapse
Death

2. Chocolate

Vomiting
Diarrhea
Rapid Breathing
Increased Heart Rate
Muscle Rigidity
Seizures
Coma
Death

3. Rodenticides

Mouse & Rat Poison

Anticoagulants Bromethalins

Bruising & Bleeding Anorexia
Difficulty Breathing Depression
Weakness Paralysis
Death Tremors
Seizures
Death

4. Antidepressant Medication

Agitation / Aggression
Sedation
Increased Heart Rate
Vomiting
Diarrhea
Tremors
Seizures

6. Chemical Hazards

Antifreeze, Paint Thinner,
Swimming Pool Chemicals

Kidney Failure
Chemical Burns
Gastrointestinal Upset
Respiratory Difficulties
Death

5. Certain indoor & Outdoor plants

Tulips Lilies

Vomiting Kidney Failure
Diarrhea Death
Hypersalivation
Depression
