




What is GigPig?




Navigating the platform

The left-hand navigation panel contains all the tools you need to post a gig.

Key sections include gig creation, templates, and artist selection.

The dashboard provides an overview of all upcoming gigs and their statuses.





Using gig templates




We recommend creating gig templates before booking gigs.

Gig templates pre-fill details to make posting gigs easier when you have repeat bookings.

Templates include essential information for artists.

You can manage your templates under the 'Gig templates' section in the left hand navigation menu.





Adding a new gig

Add a new gig


Select "Add a New Gig"

Choose the date, start time, and end time

Select your venue

Enter an event name

Choose the type of artist you would like





Setting up gig details


Add a new gig

Select the artist type you're looking for.

Set the performance fee (100% goes to the artist, GigPig takes no commission).

Use dropdown filters to refine your artist search.

Specify genres for the event.





Artist instructions & perfomance details


Add a new gig

If you've added a template, all relevant details will be included automatically.

Specify:

- Performance times
- Soundcheck details
- Equipment provided vs. what artists need to bring

You can also add music guidelines and even share a Spotify playlist for inspiration.





Payment terms


Add a new gig

Payments are handled via invoice on the GigPig platform.

Artists are paid within 14 days after you sign off on the gig.

If you prefer to pay in cash, toggle the "Cash Payment" option.

Once a gig is signed off, the artist fee is automatically deducted from your saved card.





Selecting artists



Choose from:

Favourite artists (your pre-populated list)

Let GigPig find artists for me

FastBook (directly book an artist you know. Search and book by name)


Once you've sent out a gig request:

Artists receive a notification via the GigPig artist app.

You'll see which artists are available.

Review artist profiles, listen to their media, and check their bios.

Click "Book Artist" to confirm.





Gig status & calendar view



Yellow = Searching for artists

Red = Pending response

Green = Artist booked

Brown = Needs sign-off




Once a gig is completed, head to:

Sign off the gig.


Preview and export invoices.

Rate the artist.





Repeating gigs



Where to find 'Repeat Gig'?

You can access it by clicking on 'go to gig' via the calendar

or


Through 'view bookings' via the pending gigs section.

You can repeat gigs by:

Selecting specific dates.


Fast Booking the previously booked artist.

Setting up a recurring schedule.





Managing payments



To add more credits:


Go to Venues Tab → Add Credit now.

Choose if you would like to pay the artists via your accounts team, or if you would like GigPig to handle artist payments.

Select the number of gigs you want to top up and click "Pay Now" (your saved card will be charged automatically).

If you host gigs frequently, check out the subscription options for bulk bookings.
