The Healthcare Enhancement for Local Public Safety (HELPS) Retirees provision of the Pension Protection Act of 2006 provides public safety officers, who often retire earlier than other occupations because of the physical demands and unique job hazards they face, with means to more affordable healthcare options. Under this provision, retired public safety officers can use up to \$3,000 annually from their pension funds tax-free, including from defined benefit and defined contribution plans, to pay for qualified health insurance and long-term care insurance premiums.

Unfortunately, health care costs have gone up dramatically since 2006 and the \$3,000 per year permitted to be utilized from the retiree's pension under the provision is no longer adequate to cover even half a year's worth of health insurance premiums.
