During Comrades week, we are once again filled with immense gratitude for our role in this iconic event. Community Chest has had the privilege of being an official Comrades charity since 1998, and this long-standing partnership continues to strengthen our work in Early Childhood Development across the Greater Durban area. The energy of the Comrades experience is something we share not only with our Superhero runners but with our volunteers, staff, and communities who come together to uplift children during their most formative years. In this newsletter, we're thrilled to share some of the wonderful initiatives that have taken place recently - from our successful Golf Day with Umduduzi, to the continued support from Weavers' Nest Pre-Primary School, and the passion of young volunteers selling raffle tickets. We also look back on our vibrant 90s Mania fundraiser, which brought people together in support of Early Childhood Development.

Due to the generosity of our loval donors, in the past 5 years Community Chest has been able to increase funding to Community Impact Partners by 67.3%. Over the last 10 years, grants to funded organisations have increased by 103% (despite the downturn during the Covid-19 pandemic).

Total grants for the 2025 / 2026 year have been approved at R20 million, to be distributed to 111 organisations. This amounts to an average increase of 10% to previously funded organisations with an additional R720 000 funding of new applicants, in the current financial year. Strengthening our impact is only made possible due to the continued and increased support of our kind donors. For them we are extremely grateful.
