

Appropriate Cleaning Supplies –

Please be sure that the chemicals that you are using meet standards and are **EPA Registered**.

To Check your Chemical:

Go to the internet

Google Product (type in product manufacturer and name)

My example is: P&G Professional Comet Disinfecting Spray

Several items will come up, skip the sites that say “Ad” in upper left corner

Click on Manufacturer (be sure NOT to click on an ad or a distributor)

My example: P&G Professional Brands Comet Disinfecting/Sanitizing Bathroom

Scroll down until you see: view SDS

Click on view SDS and choose language preference

Once SDS sheet is on your screen, scroll down to: **Section 15 Regulatory Information**

At bottom of the section, you will find: EPA Registration #3573-54

Cleaning Chemicals SOP

As a general guideline, service providers should use a hydrogen peroxide-based sanitizer for cleaning five days per week and a hospital grade quaternary disinfectant two days per week for all sink, counter, toilet, urinal and partition surfaces as well as restroom doors and door handles. All cleaning products MUST be fragrance free / odorless.

A schedule should be set for chemical use, i.e., sanitizer used on Friday and Saturday and Monday through Wednesday, a disinfectant used on Sunday and Thursday.

Supervisors must always be alert to the need of using disinfectant on sanitizer days when necessary due to obvious bodily fluid or waste contamination or similar occurrence.

Just a final FYI – if you are cleaning with a hydrogen peroxide based sanitizer, and then go over the same area with a Quaternary Disinfectant, you can save time by just using the Quat Cleaner as it has a higher kill rate.

Sidewalk Edging

Edging definition

On an aesthetic level, "landscape" or "garden," or "lawn" edging (the terms are used more or less interchangeably) is a line of demarcation that creates visual interest in a landscape by separating one segment of your yard from another.

All Rest Area **sidewalks (concrete)** should be edged with an edger, not a String Trimmer.

Blacktop pathways (usually at Waysides and seasonal sites) can have the edges of the path trimmed with a String Trimmer.

Posters should be held in place with push pins

1 pin in each corner for regular 9x11 sheet, more pins added as poster gets larger so that posters remain flat

All posters need to be in good condition & not faded

Please be sure the exterior of the map case is clean and crisp. Paint faded metal please.

Map Case No-No's:

(cases you are responsible for, not CVB's)

Cannot promote an individual business

Nothing Religious

Nothing Political

Outdated material must be removed immediately

If something has a date on it, please remove as soon as the date has passed

Seasonal Items – make sure posters are appropriate for current season

This should already be done -- Please remove:

“Celebrating 30 Years”

Green background with white State

Any awards from Governor Walker

Anything with RFW/RAM/or incorrect names

Map Case: Above & Beyond

Does it take time?

Remember – perception is reality 😊
