

Electrical - Assured Equipment Grounding

Insulation and grounding are two recognized means of preventing injury during electrical equipment operation.

Ensure the following guidelines are being followed:

- Do you use temporary power that is not part of a building's permanent wiring?
 - If so, you need to have an Assured Equipment Grounding program and/or require the use of Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCI).
- If you choose to use an Assured Equipment Grounding Program you must comply with the following criteria.
 - GFCI's do not eliminate the need to inspect extension cords and cords on portable tools.
- Is a written description of the program available at the work site?
- Has a competent, trained person been designated by the employer to implement the program?
- Are flexible cords and portable tools checked for continuity on a quarterly basis (at a minimum) and color-coded as having been checked?
- Is there a daily visual check and prompt corrective action if any deficiency is discovered?
