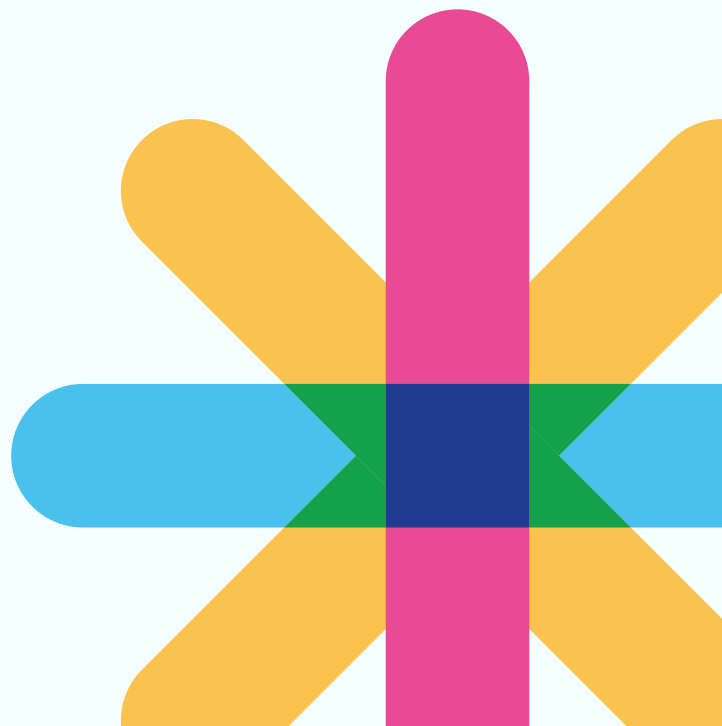
How we Report our Fundraising

At the WHO Foundation, funds are mobilized from a wide range of donors to support both WHO's programs and the Foundation's operating costs. Each year, total fundraising performance (funds mobilized) is published in the [Annual Report](#), which also includes data on the contributions received within the year (also available online via our [contribution tables](#)).

"Funds mobilized" reflects both funding raised for WHO's programs, and funding raised for the Foundation's own operational costs. Since 2024, the Foundation has shifted towards mobilizing multi-year commitments in alignment with WHO's priority of increasing more predictable and sustainable financing. For multi-year donations, we report the total amount in the year the commitment is made in our [Annual Report](#), as a measure of fundraising performance.

The disbursements from multi-year donations are paid in annual installments by our donors once agreed conditions are met, and the Foundation then transfers those funds on to WHO under the terms of the relevant agreement. This data is reflected in [Table 1: WHO Foundation Transfers to WHO 2024-2030](#).

In any given calendar year, we also report the contributions received by the WHO Foundation between January 1 to December 31 in both our [Annual Report](#) and the Contribution Tables. These contributions include funding for WHO activities and for the WHO Foundation's operational costs. See [Table 2: WHO Foundation Contributions 2025](#).

The WHO Foundation estimates the value of future funding transfers to WHO based on two sources: secured multi-year funding, and funding under negotiation with prospective donors at the time of publication.

The amounts in the table above represent the net funding the WHO Foundation transferred to WHO in 2024 and 2025, as well as estimated net transfers to WHO through 2030. In 2024, the WHO Foundation additionally transferred US\$2,106 to GAVI the Vaccines Alliance.

The Foundation's Contribution Tables are published to provide transparent reporting on the sources and value of contributions received by the WHO Foundation. As they are reported in USD, while audited financial statements are prepared in CHF, figures may differ due to exchange rate fluctuations.

Contributions are accepted from individuals or legal entities, either through the online tools provided by the WHO Foundation or via bank transfers. While amounts are reported in the table in US\$, contributors may have transferred funds in other currencies.
