

# How to elevate your Halloween celebrations

## WEAR

## DECORATE

Then you can accentuate this with large crystals like obsidian, known for its protective and balancing qualities, orange calcite, which gives pumpkin vibes, and clear quartz, which takes energy from surrounding crystals to amplify their effect. If you can find these crystals carved into a skull shape, so much the better!

Create a spooky forest area with lots of black tree ornaments and creepy forest animals – make sure to throw in a black cat too! If they're not black, you can easily spray them the right colour.

## DRINKS

A classy party needs cocktails and there are some fantastic options when it comes to spooky themes.

Get the party started with a Corpse Reviver, a potent blend of cognac, calvados and red vermouth.

Then impress your guests with a Pumpkin Spice Margarita, a delicious mix of Cointreau, lemon juice, lime juice, tequila and pumpkin puree.

Make a Bloody Rum Punch with white rum, Triple Sec, red wine, lime juice and sugar syrup, with a few slices of fruit floating around to ensure guests can always help themselves to a drink.

And then finish the event with a Rotten Pumpkin, which mixes Black Sambuca and orange juice.
