Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in the UK, with nearly 55,000 diagnosed annually—equivalent to one every 10 minutes. LFBC is dedicated to making a difference through initiatives like Hug-in-a-Bag, which has delivered over 4,750 bags filled with

comforting items to patients across 27 Midlands hospitals, all free of charge thanks to the generosity of our supporters.

Breast cancer affects one in eight women in the UK, and risk increases with age, with 80% of cases occurring in women over 50.
