RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Stallions may only be shown in Senior Classes. A neck rope must securely tie all stallions, in addition to the regular halter rope.
2. Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials or contestants on the part of owner, groom, rider, driver, parent of horse, will result in entry disqualification.
3. No tie downs, martingales and mechanical hackamores to be used, except Gymkhanas.
4. All foals to be tied or penned.
5. No two people may use the same horse in any class division.
6. All protests must be made before horses leave the ring. Protest fee is first prize money in the class that the protest is being made. Protests must be in writing.
7. Riding horses in front of barns is permitted at a walk only. Riding in barns is prohibited.
8. Proper dress code must be always used. This includes cowboy boots, long sleeved shirts & hats. Failure to abide by this rule could result in disqualification.

9. Helmet Rule Compliance – Effective April 1, 2009, every person under the age of 18 years to always wear an approved safety helmet in the competition arena, even in halter and showmanship.

10. No refund on entry fees unless class is cancelled 11. Competitors may only ride in their own age groups & Open Classes. Revision Made July 29, 2026 as per discretion of the Show committee.

Pee-Wee competitors may elect to compete in a Junior A division instead of Pee-wee. If they choose to move up, they must compete in Junior A for the entire show and are not eligible to compete in peewee classes, peewee prizes or the peewee high point buckle.

12. All other matters at the discretion of the committee. 13. All contestants must sign waiver forms.

14. Pre-registration is not required but very appreciative as we have now switched over to a computer system. Pre-registration will open July 6th and close August 4th, 2026.

Pre-registration will include gate admission within fees.

ONLY FOR THOSE THAT PRE REGISTER. Gate passes will be available for pick up at the Ag Society office prior to the show date. Those who pick up their passes ahead of time will get their names entered for an Austins Gift card. If you are not able to pick up your passes before the show date or make prior arrangements, please speak to Michaela Barber.

15. Limited stalls please specify if you need stalling overnight. 16. Livestock trailers to be parked south of the Agriplex. 17. Northwest Territorial Days Light Horse Committee and The Battlefords Agricultural Society do not accept responsibility for loss, injury or damage to contestants, spectators, horses, or other property.

1st Place= 10 points

2nd Place= 8 points

3rd Place= 6 points

4th Place= 4 points

5th Place= 2 points

6th Place= 1 point

The high point winners will be determined from the show day and gymkhana combined.

At the end of each show day all points earned by horse/rider combination will be added up.

Tie Breaker Rule:

In the event there is a tie for the high point buckle, we will follow this format to determine the winner.

1. Most 1st place finishes will win.
2. If still tied the 2nd place finishes wins.
3. If still tied, highest placing in barrels or western pleasure wins.
4. If still tied, Co-champions (and another buckle will be ordered)

Pre-Registration Entry Fees (Includes admission and Office Fee) AGE GROUP(as of January 1, 2025) ENTRY FEES

1. Pee Wee fee 10 & Under \$10 Per Day
2. Junior B 11-14 \$50 Per Day (Pre Entries Only)
3. Junior A 15-17 \$50 Per Day (Pre Entries Only)
4. Open 18 yr & older \$50 Per Day (Pre Entries Only)

Day of the Show Entry Fees:

Pee wees- \$10 Per Day

Junior A & B- \$12 per class, gate admission and \$10 office fee. Open- \$12 per class, gate admission and \$10 office fee.

OTHER FEES:

Camping Fee \$25.00 per day per unit (plus GST & PST)

Tack Stalls \$20.00 per stall (plus GST) (if available)

*Barn Pass \$5.00 (one pass only per exhibiting family. These will also be sold at inside gate.

This is a service pass NOT A PARKING PASS.

Apparel and Equipment

- 1) Hoof polish is discouraged
- 2) Braided or banded manes and artificial hair extensions are discouraged.
- 3) Trimming inside ears is discouraged.
- 4) Trimming bridal path is allowed, also of fetlocks, or excessive (long) facial hair.
- 5) Grooming allowances will be made for horses exhibited in additional classes.
- 6) Equipment with silver should not count over a good working outfit. Silver on bridle and saddle is discouraged.
- 7) It is suggested that competitors use a breast collar and rear cinch. 8) When exhibiting in a snaffle bit or hackamore, an exhibitor may switch between two hands and one hand on the reins at any time.

Apparel and Equipment

- 1)Hoof polish is discouraged

- 3)Trimming inside ears is discouraged.
- 4)Trimming bridle path is allowed, also of fetlocks, or excessive (long) facial hair.

- 7)It is suggested that competitors use a breast collar and rear cinch.

Ranch Trail

This class should test the horse's ability to cope with situations encountered while being ridden through a pattern of obstacles generally found during everyday ranch work.

Class Requirements

The ranch trail class will include no less than six items and no more than nine obstacles.

Mandatory Obstacles and Maneuvers

Ride over obstacles on the ground. Walk, jog or lope may be used but only one gait is required. Walk overs 26-30 inches spacing and formation can be straight, curved, zigzagged or raised no more than 10 inches high. Trot overs 36-42 inches spacing, formation can be straight curved zigzagged or raised no more than 10 inches high. Lope overs no more than 3 logs no more than 10 inches high. No more than two logs may be used in

succession. The spacing between the logs should be 6 to 7 feet. The formation can be straight, curved, zigzagged or raised.

- 1) Ride over wooden bridge – should be sturdy, safe and negotiated at a walk only. Heavy plywood lying flat on ground is an acceptable simulation of a bridge. Minimum width shall be 36 inches.
- 2) Backing obstacles are to be spaced at a minimum of 28 inches. If elevated, 30 inches spacing required. Back through and around at least three markers. Back through L, V, U or straight or similarly shaped course which may be elevated no more than 24 inches.
- 3) Side-pass obstacle: any obstacle which is safe and of any length may be used to demonstrate responsiveness of the horse to leg signals. Raised side pass should not exceed 12 inches.
- 4) Swing rope or throw rope at a dummy steer head.
- 5) pick up feet.
- 6) Trot through cones spaced a minimum of 6 feet apart.

Optional Obstacles

May include but not limited to:

- 1) Jump center height no less than 14 inches or more than. Holding the saddle horn is permitted for this obstacle.
- 2) Only live or stuffed animals which would normally be encountered in an outdoor setting
- 3) Carry objects from one part of arena to the other.
- 4) Trot through cones spaced a minimum of 6 feet apart.
- 5) Cross natural ditches or ride up embankments.
- 6) Swing rope or throw rope at a dummy steer head.

- 7) Step in and out of obstacle.
- 8) Put on a slicker or coat.
- 9) Stand to mount with mounting block
- 10) walk through water obstacles.
- 11) open gate on foot
- 12) pick up feet.
- 13) Walk through brush.
- 14) Ground tie.
- 15) Lead at a trot.
