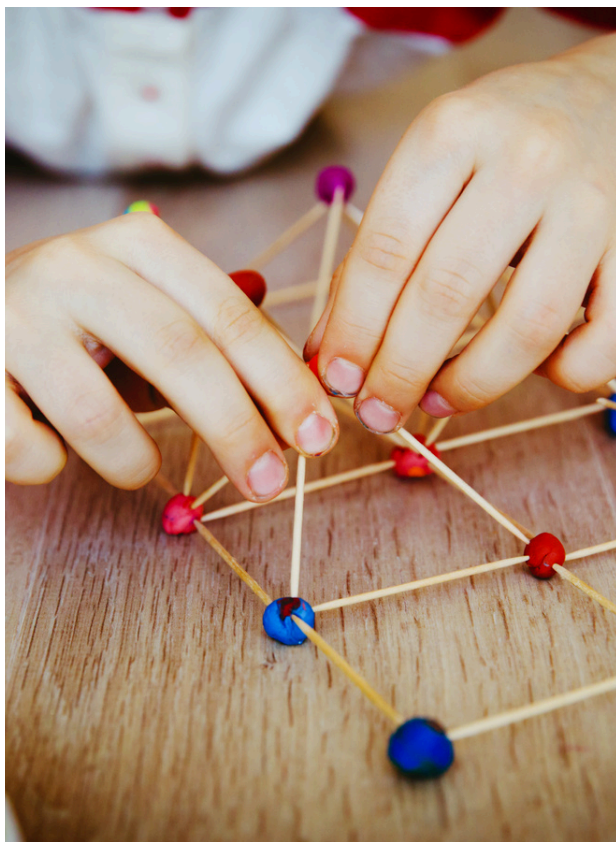
ORAL LANGUAGE: AN EVENING OF EXPLORING AND SHARING SONGS

Thursday, July 9th, 2026 • 7:00-9:00PM • Online • Cost: \$5.00 • Suitable for child care providers, child care workforce, and parents.

Join Maureen Doll online for an evening of exploring and sharing songs, stories and rhymes and why this matters in the early years. Please come prepared with your favourite children's song or rhyme so that we can share the classics that are important to us as we learn about why and how song and rhyme are crucial in the early years.

STEM LEARNING WITH LOOSE PARTS

Thursday, July 30th, 2026 • 7:00-9:00PM • Online • Cost: \$5.00 • Suitable for child care providers, child care workforce, and parents.

STEM teaching is an interdisciplinary approach to learning where children learn and apply concepts in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Inspired by the Early Learning Framework in this workshop the participants will learn how to plan provocations that invite children to observe, explore, investigate, problem-solve, experiment, and design. We will explore ways to integrate STEM language throughout the day to help children think like scientists. This workshop will help educators to understand the importance of loose parts and how to use them in various ways to promote the STEM learning with young children and implement a child friendly curriculum that will prepare children for the 21st century.

Presenter: Pooja Kalsi

Pooja Kalsi has a Master's degree in Early Childhood Education. She has 28 years of experience in the Early Childhood field as a teacher, facilitator, supervisor, director and instructor. She is very passionate about finding ways to promote children's creativity and expression of discovery. She currently teaches at Langara College in the ECE department.

CONNECTIONS IN NATURE FOR ALL CHILDREN

Developing a connection with nature is an integral piece of childhood. Through interactions with the natural world, children develop a sense of wonder, calm, joy, and fascination. In this interactive session, we explore placebased learning with children of all ages. We discuss ways of moving past challenges, engaging stakeholders, and exploring simple and meaningful open-ended play ideas and learning invitations that bring children outside and bring nature in. Participants will leave with a nature play idea kit filled with strategies and inspiration, including ideas that require little to no preparation or materials and ideas that include Aboriginal perspectives and understandings.

Karen Begley supports educators to feel fantastic about the work they are already doing by making connections between their values, programming, and pedagogical theory. Her playful style makes for interactive workshops that generate new ideas and increase participants' confidence and competency to bring practical and enriching experiences to the children in their care. EXPLORING BIAS AND COLLABORATIVE TEAM BUILDING IN CHILDCARE

In this workshop, we'll explore how bias can show up in our everyday work with children and colleagues and how greater self-awareness can help us create more inclusive environments. We'll also look at different communication styles, common challenges in team settings and simple strategies to handle misunderstandings. Through discussion and practical examples, you'll gain tools to strengthen teamwork, communicate more effectively, and support a positive, respectful workplace.

Throughout her career, she has worked closely with families and childcare centres to build strong understanding around inclusion and adaptive practices. RESPONSIBLE ADULT: 20 HOUR CHILD CARE TRAINING COURSE

Monday, September 14th - Friday, September 25th (weekdays), 2026 • 10:00AM-12:00PM • Online • Cost: \$25.00 • Suitable for child care providers and child care workforce.

This course fulfills the 20-hour training requirement to become a "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by Child Care Licensing Regulations. The content covers topics such as child development, behaviour, health, safety, nutrition, and programming. The course is live and interactive, so participants must have both video and audio capabilities.

Participants are required to: be at least 19 years old at the time of registration, demonstrate Grade 8 proficiency in both written and spoken English (or an equivalent level) to engage actively in class, and attend all sessions to earn a certificate of completion.

Upon successfully completing this course, participants will be qualified to work as a Responsible Adult in various environments, including School-age Child Care Programs, Licensed Family Child Care, as additional support or substitutes in Licensed Preschool and Child Care Programs, as well as Summer Camps.
