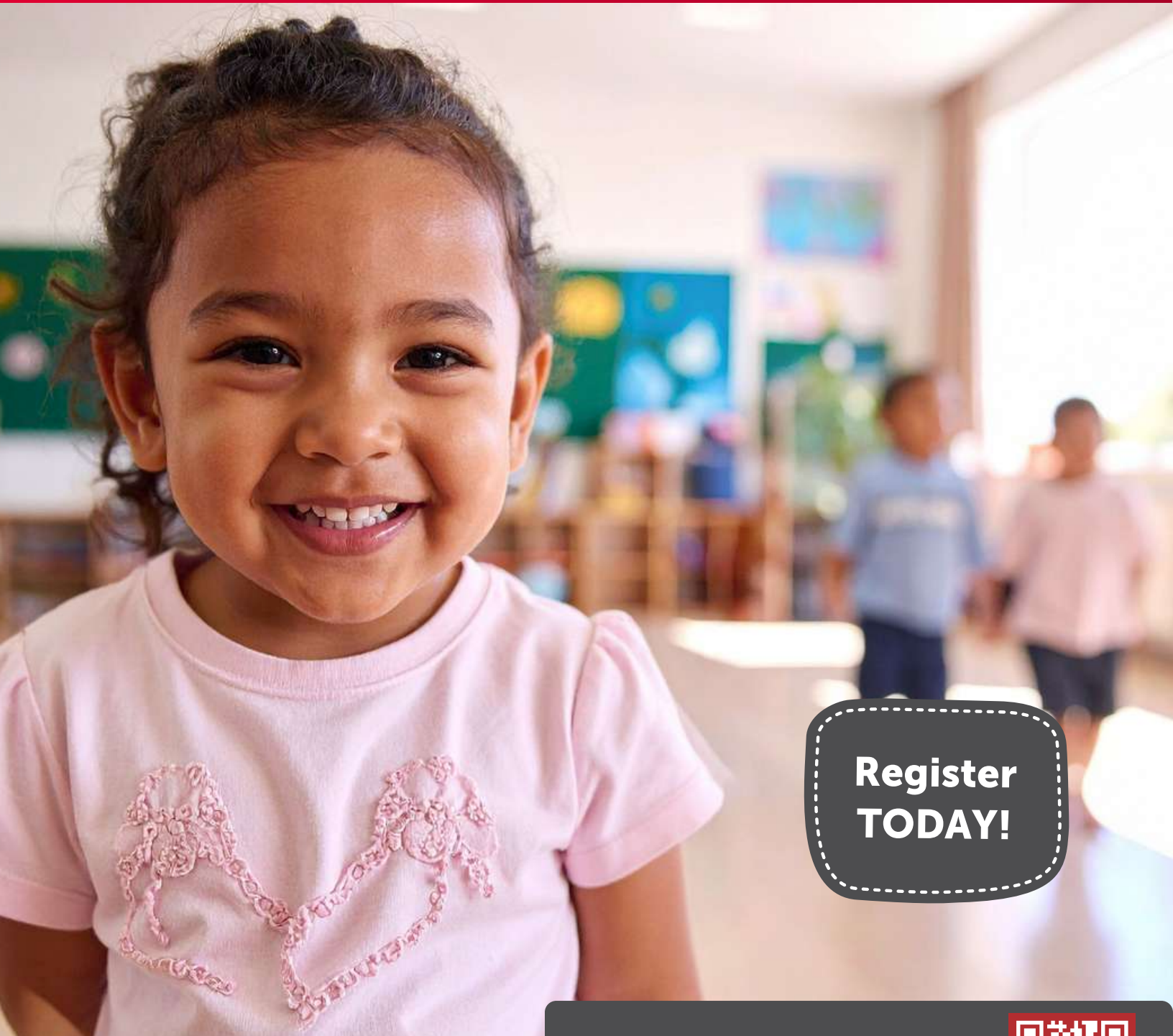

STEM LEARNING WITH LOOSE PARTS

STEM teaching is an interdisciplinary approach to learning where children learn and apply concepts in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Inspired by the Early Learning Framework in this workshop the participants will learn how to plan provocations that invite children to observe, explore, investigate, problem-solve, experiment, and design. We will explore ways to integrate STEM language throughout the day to help children think like scientists. This workshop will help educators to understand the importance of loose parts and how to use them in various ways to promote the STEM learning with young children and implement a child friendly curriculum that will prepare children for the 21st century.

Presenter: Pooja Kalsi

Pooja Kalsi has a Master's degree in Early Childhood Education. She has 28 years of experience in the Early Childhood field as a teacher, facilitator, supervisor, director and instructor. She is very passionate about finding ways to promote children's creativity and expression of discovery. She currently teaches at Langara College in the ECE department.



CONNECTIONS IN NATURE FOR ALL CHILDREN

EXPLORING BIAS AND COLLABORATIVE TEAM BUILDING IN CHILDCARE

In this workshop, we'll explore how bias can show up in our everyday work with children and colleagues and how greater self-awareness can help us create more inclusive environments. RESPONSIBLE ADULT: 20 HOUR CHILD CARE TRAINING COURSE

Monday, September 14th - Friday, September 25th (weekdays), 2026 • 10:00AM-12:00PM • Online • Cost: \$25.00 • Suitable for child care providers and child care workforce.

This course fulfills the 20-hour training requirement to become a "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by Child Care Licensing Regulations. The content covers topics such as child development, behaviour, health, safety, nutrition, and programming. The course is live and interactive, so participants must have both video and audio capabilities.

Participants are required to: be at least 19 years old at the time of registration, demonstrate Grade 8 proficiency in both written and spoken English (or an equivalent level) to engage actively in class, and attend all sessions to earn a certificate of completion.

Upon successfully completing this course, participants will be qualified to work as a Responsible Adult in various environments, including School-age Child Care Programs, Licensed Family Child Care, as additional support or substitutes in Licensed Preschool and Child Care Programs, as well as Summer Camps.

Experiences with unspun sheep's wool offer a wide range of creative possibilities for both children and adults. The properties of natural wool appeal to the imagination in a vivid and inspirational manner. Participants will be introduced to forms of wool fibers, process of wet wool felting and its meditative nature. In our engagement with wool as a medium and through the process of felting, we uncover possibilities for experimentation, (self) inquiry, and story-ing pedagogical narratives. Participants will have an opportunity to engage in an exploratory process of wet felting a two-dimensional, abstract interpretation of a landscape consisting of an array of colours specific to the Pacific Northwest, and a three-dimensional 'nesting barnacles'.

Take a moment to reflect on how much you were raised to value 'productivity'. At its core this value is a wonderful and important part of any society or individual's life. Shelley Moore has worked with students, classrooms, and schools K-12 as a teacher, leader, consultant, and coach. She is also an adjunct professor at the University of British Columbia working with teacher candidates beginning their career. Shelley holds an undergraduate degree in Special Education (University of Alberta), a master's (SFU), and a Ph.D. (UBC). Her first book, *One Without the Other*, is a best seller and is a follow-up resource to her January 2016 TEDx talk.

The Inclusive planning process is aiming to situate Disability as an identity, not a deficit, and so to determine what supports and strategies children require, teams are shifting to look at needs, instead of disabilities, as a reference point.

In this session, participants will learn about strength-based dimensions and how to gather and incorporate this data when planning for and making decisions in child and youth community settings. Participants will learn to use a tool to identify the needs of children, and look at how prioritizing needs can positively impact the entire community. Lastly, we will explore how Universal Design for Learning (UDL) can be used as an anchor to reduce barriers and can be embedded into everyday routines, activities, and environments.
