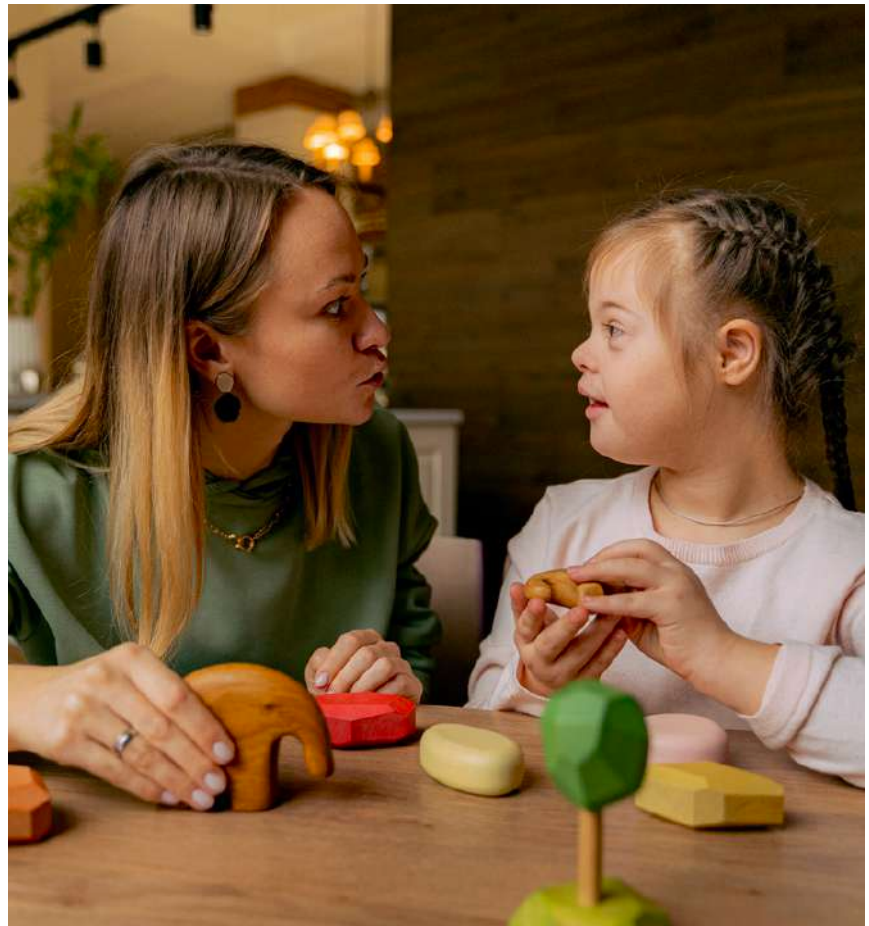
GROWING INCLUSIVE PRACTICE TOGETHER

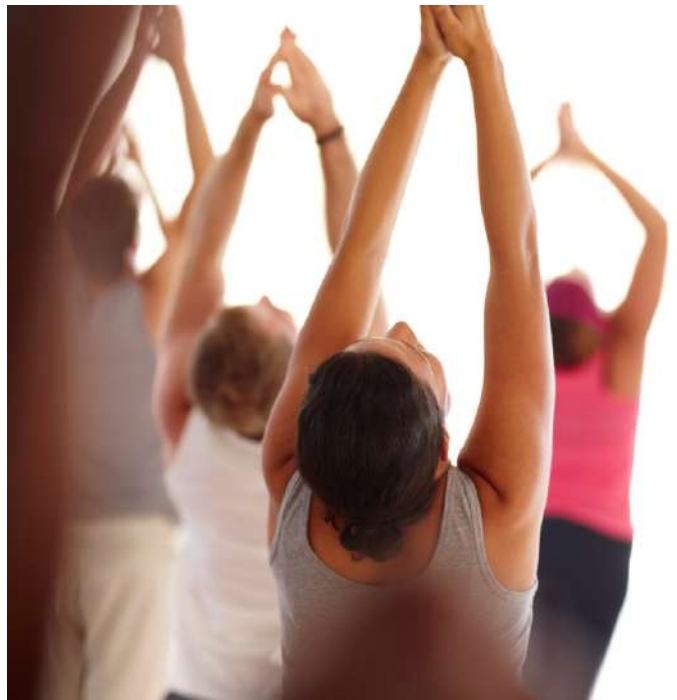
