

Cleanup:

Please place dirty towels on the bathroom floor or in the washer. Please pull back the covers on the beds you used. Lastly, please remove any food from the fridge and dispose of the garbage in the cans outside.

Please let us know if anything is damaged.

Before you leave, please check that all windows are closed and the doors are locked.

COTTAGE RULES



- Guest authorization: Only the number of guests confirmed on the booking are allowed at the cottage. This is a policy by the rental sites. Parties and events are not allowed.
- No smoking: Guests: Please no smoking. This includes the use of tobacco, cannabis, e-cigarettes, etc.
- Security device interference: Please do not tamper with or remove an approved and appropriately disclosed security or monitoring device. There is one camera on the front and one on the back for security purposes only. No cameras are inside the cottage.
- Cleanliness: Please treat this like your own home! We ask that all dishes be loaded into the dishwasher and trash taken out to the dumpster before leaving.
- Checkout time: Guests should complete checkout by the designated checkout time, which is 10AM. Please leave used towels on the floor, pull back covers on the beds you've used, dispose of items in the refrigerator, and take the trash out.
- Noise levels: Quiet time is designated between 10PM and 7AM. This is to respect our neighbors.
- Please do not leave your pet alone in the cottage for extended time periods. If you must leave them alone for a short time, please use one of the crates under the bed in the bedroom near the bathroom.
- Please leave all remotes near their respective devices when you leave this includes the TV, fireplace, and four splits.

We ask that you please let us know before your stay if you are bringing your dog with you so we can make the necessary arrangements. Our pet fee is \$145 for the first dog. There is no additional charge for the second dog. We have a two dog limit unless otherwise discussed.

HOME GUIDE

Instructions in using home equipment and devices. Please put all remotes back when you leave - we don't want to lose them!

SMART TV

Turn on the TV with the remote and navigate to your desired platform. You can use the high-speed wifi to connect your favorite streaming services.

HEATING & COOLING

Until recently, this cottage was a seasonal cottage only— so Mini Splits were installed for heating and cooling purposes. You can adjust the temperature by using the remotes or the black thermostat. Navigate to the mode you would like; Cooling, Heating, or Fan - then set your desired temperature. If you need help, feel free to text me and I can remotely adjust them for you.

FIREPLACE

The fireplace is electric and can be turned on with the remote!

COFFEE & TEA STATION

There is a drip coffee pot in the kitchen. There is a coffee and tea station near the coffee pot with coffee, tea, flavored syrups, cream, and sugar. There are extra coffee filters in the cabinet as well.



GARBAGE

Please place all of your garbage in the bins near the shed. You do not need to take these bins to the road. They will be emptied after you check out.

EXTRA LINENS

There are extra linens and towels in the cabinets in the laundry room.

EXTRA BLANKETS

There are extra blankets in each bedroom as well as the basket in the living room.

EXTRA PILLOWS

There are extra pillows in each bedroom as well as the closets.

BEACH TOWELS

There are beach towels in the laundry room cabinet. Feel free to use them!

TOILETS + SEPTIC

The house is on septic, so please only flush toilet paper!









THINGS TO DO AT THE COTTAGE

KAYAKS, CANOE & PADDLEBOAT

There are two kayaks, a canoe, and a paddleboat for your use during the warm months. You can find them on the wooden rack on the beach in the backyard. Please put cover on paddleboat after using it.

HAMMOCKS

There are two hammocks available for use. You can find them in the backyard in the trees. Grab a book and relax by the water!

BOAT DOCK

We have a boat dock available for your use Memorial Day through Labor Day. Please be sure to securely fasten your boat or jet-ski to the tie out poles near the dock. The lake can get very windy. The boat launch is just a few miles down the road. It's called Intermediate Lake Boat Launch.



BOOKS & GAMES

There are many books and games in the dinning room for you to use. If you can't find a book you like there, take a look in the primary bedroom bookshelf! Upstairs you will find a checker's table and pinball machine!

TURNTABLE & MUSIC

In the dinning room, you'll find a turntable and records - grab one and fill the cottage with music from years past — or use the Bluetooth feature to connect your phone!

FISHING

Near the back door, you will find fishing rods and lures! Fishing is best about 5 feet from the end of the dock - there is a drop off to 85 ft

BUILD A FIRE

There is a fire pit in the backyard that guests can use. Feel free to grab a few logs or pick some up at The Corner Store and relax by the fire. Summer guests will find a S'mores basket near the backdoor. There are extra marshmallow sticks in the shed in the backyard also.

ABOUT THE AREA



HISTORY OF CENTRAL LAKE

Central Lake was given a post office in 1869. James M. Wadsworth started a store here in 1872. The village was platted in 1883. The Chicago and Western Railroad put a depot in Central Lake in 1892. It was incorporated as a village in 1895. Central Lake is a popular vacation destination to this day.

According to the United States Census Bureau, the village has a total area of 1.25 square miles (3.24 km2), of which, 1.07 square miles (2.77 km2) of it is land and 0.18 square miles (0.47 km2) is water.

If you're interested, head over to the dinning room and take a look at the historical postcards from Central Lake!

HISTORY OF INTERMEDIATE LAKE

Appropriately named, Intermediate Lake is situated approximately in the middle of the Elk River Chain of Lakes, which is a series of 14 lakes and interconnecting waterways that eventually flows out into East Grand Traverse Bay. Intermediate Lake is a long, sinuous lake located between Hanley Lake (upstream) and Lake Bellaire (downstream) and connected to both via the Intermediate River. Intermediate Lake began as a river and became a lake when the Bellaire Dam was created. In fact, Intermediate Lake was at one time called Central Lake - thus how the city of Central Lake came to be named.

The town of Central Lake is located at the lake's north end and in fact, Intermediate Lake was at one time known as Central Lake. Although the north end of Intermediate Lake has a lot of residential development, a large expanse of coniferous forested wetland exists at the southern end of the lake. Most of the near-shore bottom of Intermediate Lake is sand or gravelly sand, with a few rocky areas and some muck. Muskgrass (Chara), native watermilfoils, and pondweeds are common aquatic plants found in the lake.

Intermediate Lake is popular for all sorts of recreational activities including fishing. Fish that have been reported through various Department of Natural Resources surveys include walleye, bluegill, logperch, yellow perch, large- and smallmouth bass, pumpkinseed, longnose gar, white sucker, rock bass, whitefish, cisco, muskellunge, northern pike, rainbow trout, lake trout, brown trout, and sunfish.



LOCAL DAY TRIPS

Explore different places and go on adventure while you stay at The Dragonfly.

TRAVERSE CITY

Traverse City is a very popular destination and is about an hour from The Dragonfly. Traverse city has ample wine tasting, cider tasing, world-class food, cherry orchards, and wonderful beaches to explore.

CHARLEVOIX

Head about 30 minutes north to Charlevoix and stop by the Charlevoix South Pier Lighthouse, one of their restaurants, or stop by Belvedere Golf course - one of the top 10 public golf courses in the state.

PETOSKEY

The Petoskey Area prides itself as a four-season destination for unique activities in every season for every vacationer. From biking, skiing, and kayaking to exploring Petoskey's Gaslight Shopping District there is something for everyone.

MACKINAC CITY & ISLAND

Mackinac city has lovely shops and restaurants to explore. Take a ferry over to the island for a day trip! No vehicles are allowed on the island, so prepare accordingly. Rent bikes and tour the island, have dinner at the Grand Hotel, or explore some local wine tasting. Don't forget to pick up some fudge! These areas are approximately an hour and a half from The Dragonfly.

BOYNE MOUNTAIN

Located in Boyne Falls, here you can ski, golf, enjoy the spa, delicious restaurants, or even explore the world's largest timber-towered suspension bridge.

SLEEPING BEAR SAND DUNES

Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore is in Michigan's Lower Peninsula and about an hour and a half from The Dragonfly. It hugs the northeast shore of Lake Michigan and includes South and North Manitou islands. The park is known for the huge scalable dunes of the Dune Climb. Beaches include Platte River Point, where the river flows into the lake. The Sleeping Bear Heritage Trail winds through forests and the Port Oneida area with its 19th-century farmsteads.

HARBOR SPRINGS

Head about an hour north to Harbor Springs. The quaint waterfront community of Harbor Springs offers an array of art galleries, culinary attractions and the deepest freshwater harbor in the Great Lakes.

ACTIVITIES WITH KIDS

BOYNE MOUNTAIN WATERPARK

Splash, Slide & Play At Avalanche Bay, The Perfect Destination For Your Aquatic Adventure. Come Join The Fun At Avalanche Bay Indoor Water Park & Enjoy 7 Waterslides And 4 Pools. Fun For The Entire Family. 88,000 Square Feet Of Fun.



GT BUTTERFLY & BUG HOUSE

The Butterfly House and the zoo exhibits opened in October 2014. The purpose of the GT Butterfly House & Bug Zoo is to create an attraction that would provide the community education and a fun place to take kids to learn about the wonders of butterflies and their bug relatives. As the Zoo grows in it's mission, there are many plans ahead!

RAVEN HILL DISCOVERY CENTER

Raven Hill Discovery Center was established in 1991 and opened in 1992, It is a unique place in northern Lower Michigan where children and adults can link science, history & the arts with hands-on activities and explorations both indoors and outdoors. The Center is located on 170 acres in Charlevoix County adjacent to Little Traverse Conservancy's Raven Ridge Nature Preserve. Raven Hill is a teaching institution where visitors learn as much from the indoor and outdoor exhibits as they do from the knowledgeable staff and volunteers. Raven Hill draws on its mission to guide its growth and development.

HARBOR SPRINGS DEER PARK

Located in the city government complex off Zoll Street is this wonderful family spot. This fenced area is the home to several deer who are used to people coming up the fence to talk to them. So visit them!

The very large, fenced in area has trees, shade, grass, and a feeding station. There is space for the deer to run and romp. Pull into the parking lot nearby and watch the deer lift their heads to see what you are up to.



BROWNWOOD ACRES

Brownwood Acres is a fifth-generation family-run business located in Central Lake, Michigan, near Bellaire. Established in 1945 as a roadside honey stand, it has evolved into a popular destination for locals and tourists alike. The property features a Country Store offering a variety of local products, including their famous cherry salsa, dried cherries, and fudge. Visitors can also explore the Old School House and Honey House, which now operates as a gift store filled with Northern Michigan items. A notable attraction is Mary Lou's Tea Room, where guests can enjoy leisurely lunches on a Victorian porch overlooking the scenic surroundings. The establishment is also renowned for its donuts, available in flavors such as maple, cinnamon sugar, chocolate, salted caramel, and cherry icing. Additionally, Brownwood Acres hosts a flea market every Sunday and offers opportunities to interact with friendly farm animals, making it a hub of community activity and family fun.







FALL COLOR TOUR

Look no further than Charlevoix to experience Northern Michigan's fall colors. During the month of October, fall colors are at their peak. Stop at any of the area apple orchards to enjoy numerous tasty treats like a slice of apple pie, you-pick apples, and apple cider. If you're out for a drive on Charlevoix's scenic country roads, be sure to stop by Rex Beach in Norwood for amazing lake views. The surrounding country side is full of gently rolling hills and abundant foliage that is sure to satisfy that fall color trip you've been waiting for.

Around Lake Charlevoix

Enjoy the views of Lake Charlevoix. The drive around Lake Charlevoix is a great color route; this journey will take you through East Jordan, Boyne City and Charlevoix.

The Breezeway

Rolling hills, picturesque Michigan farms, and the south arm of Lake Charlevoix are highlights of this tour. Beginning in Atwood, pass through Ellsworth and East Jordan, and finishes in Boyne Falls.

Torch Lake Tour

Head south out of Charlevoix toward Eastport. This scenic drive will take you along Torch Lake. There are sure to be great fall colors. Enjoy craft beer, food, and live music at Shorts Brewery on Bridge St. downtown Bellaire.

Jordan River Valley

Be sure to enjoy the scenic overlooks including the spectacular Jordan River Valley. From Charlevoix, head south toward East Jordan. Travel through Boyne Falls and Boyne Falls before returning to Charlevoix for an evening on the town.

After a day of exploring Northern Michigan, stop downtown Charlevoix for dinner, a craft beer, or a tasty treat. Explore downtown boutiques for amazing fall discounts and one of a kind merchandise. Just before the sun sets, stroll along the pier toward the lighthouse and enjoy the sunset on Lake Michigan. Celebrate nature's harvest at the annual Apple Festival. Enjoy an art and craft show, a variety of food vendors and family-friendly events.
