Review and subsidise the cost of trips and residential visits for disadvantaged pupils. Increase curriculum-linked outdoor learning opportunities. Audit and promote use of local parks and green spaces within the curriculum. 	
3. Continue to promote equality, diversity, and inclusion across the curriculum and school environment.	 Review curriculum content to ensure representation of different cultures, identities, and perspectives. Use assemblies and displays to celebrate diversity and shared values. 	
4. Monitor outcomes for pupils with SEND and other vulnerable groups to ensure equitable progress and provision.	 Track attainment and progress data by pupil group termly. Strengthen collaboration between class teachers, SENDCo, and support staff. Involve parents and pupils in reviewing individual plans and targets.
