Hot Ash Warning

Never place hot ashes in your trash container.



- Hot ash from bonfires, fire pits, wood stoves and fireplaces can start a fire in containers and trucks
- Ashes can stay hot for many days
- Allow up to 7 days to cool

End of Season Yardwaste



The 2026 season is scheduled to end Saturday, November 28th, 2026
- weather permitting -

Keep your container at your property over the winter for convenient storage for hoses, rakes, and more.

Service will resume in spring 2027.
Watch for additional communication with season start details in the Spring.

Minnesota state law prohibits mixing brush, trees or yard waste with your household garbage. *Charges or service interruptions may be applied if contaminated.*

Here are some helpful reminders

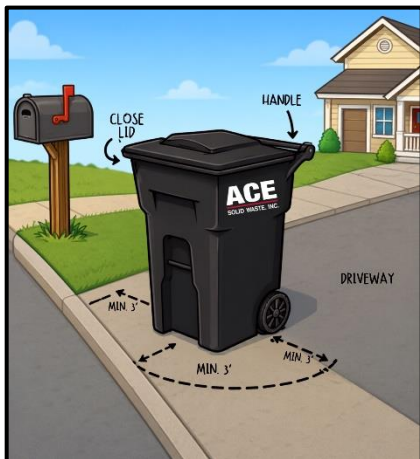
- Stay out of the street and wait for the bus
- Trucks may suddenly move forward or back up
- Garbage trucks make frequent stops
- Stay at least 10 feet away
- Never chase a garbage truck
- Never walk behind a garbage truck

Placement



Container(s) should be streetside the night before service or by 6 AM to ensure collection.

To create maximum safety and efficiency, please place your container(s) no more than 3ft from the street and keep a 3ft clearance from other carts or obstructions such as mailboxes, light posts, utility poles, fire hydrants, low hanging branches, shrubs, or vehicles.

Make sure the handle is facing the residence and there are not overhead obstructions.

Battery Disposal



When batteries are thrown in the trash or recycling, they can start dangerous fires. These fires have caused property damage, disrupted waste and recycling services, and resulted in injuries and deaths.
