Read 2 Corinthians 5:16-21 out loud and allow time for reflection and observation of the passage of Scripture.

Step 3: Discuss

This film deals with death (sin) and life (resurrection). Which do you relate to right now and why?

2 Corinthians 5:17 says that "if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation." What does that statement mean?

How has Christ given us a "ministry of reconciliation" and what is a ministry of reconciliation?

How are you or how can you become a minister of reconciliation in your present life right now?

Since his birth, Noa has faced suffering and hardship. What is often your initial response when you're met with challenges in life?

Psalm 139 reveals how intimately God knows you. What might this say about His concern for you, even when you meet hardship?

Despite their circumstances, Noa and his mother have found an abiding peace in Christ. How does recalling what Jesus has secured for you help in times of trouble?

Rejoice! God knows your days and, in Christ, has wonderful plans for you. How can this truth change how you live, work, and love others today?

The film mentions being orphaned by sin, meaning we left our Heavenly Father to go our own way. How was this true for you?

Verses 6-8 show us that our reconciliation with God came at great cost. What does this reveal about God's character and love?

Considering how Tirfe's life radically changed through adoption, how does the truth of reconciliation and adoption into God's family change the way you live your life today?

How can you share the doctrine of adoption to minister to people who are hurting, lonely, and orphaned by sin?

Watch *Alex was an Atheist* with your small group and allow time for reflection and observation after the film is finished.

Step 2: Read

Read John 4:7-15 out loud and allow time for reflection and observation of the passage of Scripture.

Step 3: Discuss

While these verses are only a snippet of the interaction between Jesus and the woman at the well, what do they teach you about what Jesus offers?

In the film, Alex says that Jesus is the only One that has truly fulfilled him, or said another way, has "satisfied his thirst". In what ways are you thirsty or lacking fulfillment in this life?

Consider the lengths that Christ went to in order to offer you living water. How does His sacrificial love help you believe that He can truly satisfy you?

For Alex, the love of Christ so deeply transformed him that he now wants to share this living water with others. Take a few minutes and ask God to give you an opportunity to share with someone how Christ has satisfied your thirst.

List the attributes of God portrayed in Psalm 46. How do they compare to the alternative "places" you seek refuge in life?

In verse 10, God commands us to "Be still". How does Christ's finished work and the indwelling Holy Spirit enable you to do that?

Watch *Beauty from Ruins* with your small group and allow time for reflection and observation after the film is finished.

Step 2: Read

Read Isaiah 61:1-3 out loud and allow time for reflection and observation of the passage of Scripture.

Step 3: Discuss

Isaiah 61:1-3 is a prophetic passage that declares God's coming restoration for those who suffer, specifically the poor, brokenhearted, captives, and those who mourn. What does this passage say about who God is?

Maria and Antonella were both unwanted and abandoned by others, which led to feeling ashamed and brokenhearted. How have you personally experienced shame and brokenness (e.g. troubled relationships, enslaving sin, struggling finances, etc.)?

Jesus quotes this same passage from Isaiah when he begins his earthly ministry (Luke 4:16-19). How is Jesus the ultimate fulfillment of God's restoration, and why is this good news for your shame and brokenness?

Because of God's great love towards them in Christ, Antonella and Maria experienced true healing. Is there something in your own heart that Christ's love needs to restore? Take a few minutes to consider this and ask Him for it.

When you think about God's love, what comes to mind? Do you doubt His love for you, and if so, why?

In verse 10, how has God demonstrated His love for you? How does this love change the way you view yourself, and in turn, love others? Be specific.

In Christ, Takashi and Naoko could truly love one another. Who is God calling you to love in response to Him loving you?

How do you relate to the "least of these" in your life? Like Bettie, do you overlook them, make excuses, or approach them like a checklist to earn God's approval?

Spiritually speaking, how were you the "least of these" before knowing Jesus?

Bettie serves those in need because she has been greatly served by Jesus. How has He served you through His life, death, and resurrection?

Read Romans 10:12-15 out loud and allow time for reflection and observation of the passage of Scripture.

Step 3: Discuss

This passage in Romans 10 makes the point that people can't call upon the name of Jesus without someone first telling them about Him. Who first shared Jesus with you, and how?

God doesn't wait for us to come to Him first. Rather, He goes the distance to pursue us. Take a few minutes to reflect on God's compassionate pursuit of you by sending Jesus, the One who came to live and die for your sake.

Motivated by Christ's love, Buddhi has great compassion for the people of Khumkhani village. Who in your own life have you felt compassion for, and why?

Buddhi gladly endures many challenges to reveal God's love to the Khumkhani people. What challenges might He be asking you to willingly face as He sends you out to share Christ with those who are in need of Him?

Step 3: Discuss

Stig hangs around the people whom society tends to either disregard or fear. Who are the people in society that you'd rather shy away from, and why?

In Luke 19, Jesus meets Zacchaeus, a wealthy man who was known as both a robber and a traitor by the people in the crowd. What do you learn about Jesus through this interaction?

Just like Zacchaeus, Stig was set free and transformed by the love of Jesus. Think about your own life before Christ. How did He seek and save you, the one who was lost?

Stig desires to love others like Christ has loved him, no matter where they've been or what they've done. What is one way God might be inviting you to do the same today?

What did God accomplish through Christ's suffering? Take time in prayer to thank Him for suffering on your behalf.

Honza found the path of life in Christ, and it changed how he viewed himself and others. What might this change look like in your own life today? Be specific.

Psalm 147 speaks of God's stunning power, love, and authority. Discuss how He compares to your response in Question 1.

Who do you know that is seeking life in other places and needs to hear about Jesus? Take time to share and pray for them now.

Verse 3 says Christ was "a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief". What's your response to the fact that Christ can relate to your suffering?

Verse 5 says Jesus was "pierced for our transgressions" to bring us peace with God. How can this truth help free you from your present griefs and sorrows?

Like Yumiko, we can be healed in Christ. Spend time reflecting on this promise and thanking Him for his healing now and for eternity.

Like Perla shares in the film, becoming a child of God isn't earned or deserved, but rather received as a gift. How does this change the way you think about being God's child?

There is no greater gift the Father has given than sacrificing His own Son to make us His children. How does the gift of Jesus reveal God's great love towards you?

1 John 3:2 talks about what is to come for those who are children of God: becoming like our Father and seeing Him as He is. How does this promise give you hope for today?

David's prophetic words in verse 1 were repeated by Jesus on the cross. What does this reveal about Jesus' ability to relate to our hardships and suffering?

How does Jesus' faithfulness bring you hope and joy? Spend time recounting His works in prayer and thank Him.

Replace your name with Kyle's in the first two questions and share your responses with the group.

The passage says that because of Christ, we are "dead to sin and alive to God". Take a moment as a group and thank God, repent, and praise Him for this wonderful truth.

Radek and Jirka came to realize that their sin leads to an eternal death. Do you think of your own sin in this way? Why or why not?

Christ's life, death, and resurrection frees you from the bondage of sin. How have you experienced this, or do you struggle to believe it?

No longer being a slave to sin means you are now a slave to God. What does it practically look like for you to live a life enslaved to our good and loving Father?

How does this eternal promise compare to the things that you experience in this world? Hardships, fleeting joys, etc.

Verses 6-7 state that trials test the genuineness of your faith. How have you seen this to be true in your life?

How should the truth that you have an "imperishable, undefiled, and unfading" inheritance waiting for you impact your life today?

Anderson and Robson couldn't help but tell others about the love and grace they found in Jesus. How might God be inviting you to bear witness about His light to others?

If you have put your faith in Christ, what are the benefits you've received in having and knowing Him and His love?

Like Yuji, we have the key to the Father and everlasting life. How is God calling you to practically share Jesus with others?

As a scientist, Josef continuously seeks after knowledge. What do you find yourself seeking after most in your life right now?

Verse 13 says that if you seek God, He will give you Himself. How is this promise better than what you often seek first in life?

Even before you sought after God, He sought after you. How does the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus prove God's pursuit of you?

How does knowing God sought you first motivate your heart to seek Him in your daily life? What would that look like practically?

God shows His ultimate strength through His saving power. While you could do nothing to save yourself from sin and death, God rescued you through His perfect Son, Jesus. How does this good news encourage you to look to Him today for strength?

Take time to pray and ask God for faith to trust in His strength. If there is a particular area of life where you are relying on yourself, ask Him to help you rely fully on Him instead.
