**ORDER GRANTING
ADMINISTRATIVE MOTION FOR
LEAVE TO FILE ADDITIONAL
MOTION FOR SUMMARY
JUDGMENT**

Re: Dkt. No. 269

The Court generally permits each party to a case to file only one dispositive motion. Defendants, however, seek leave to file an additional joint motion for summary judgment arguing that certain final judgments arising from prior proceedings in the Western District of Texas and the International Trade Commission have a preclusive effect here.

Because resolving this issue conclusively at an early stage of this litigation may simplify future proceedings, defendants' motion is granted. Defendants' motion shall be filed within 21 days of this Order and shall address only the preclusive effect of the prior judgments identified above. Defendants' motion and supporting memorandum shall be no longer than 12 pages in length. Plaintiff's opposition shall be no longer than 12 pages in length and shall be filed no later than 14 days after the filing of defendants' motion. Defendants' reply shall be no longer than 7 pages in length and shall be filed no later than 7 days after the filing of plaintiff's response. Defendants shall notice the hearing for a date no earlier than 21 days after the filing of their reply.
