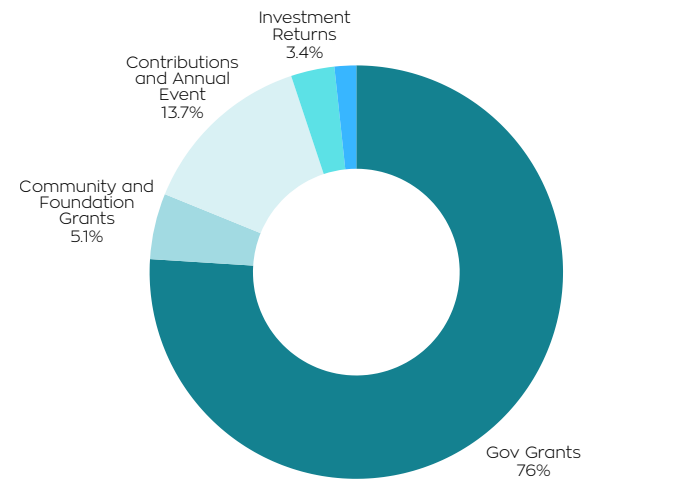

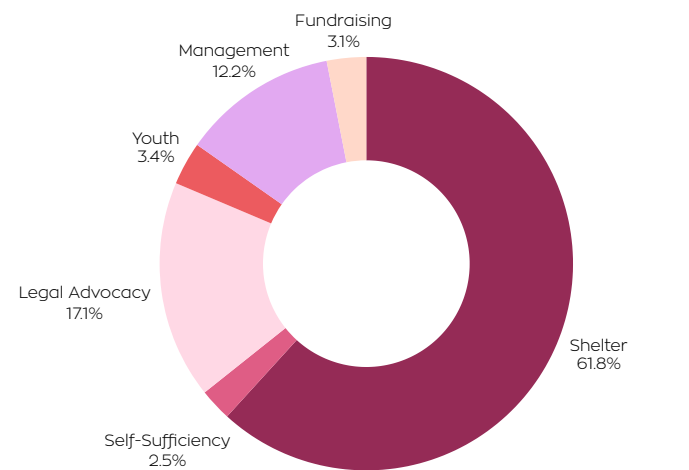

SPOTLIGHT: EXPANDING OUR SERVICE THROUGH PARTNERSHIP

Safe Haven's strong community partnerships help us provide vital resources for survivors of domestic violence each and every day. Many of these partnerships bring immediate assistance to our clients in their moment of greatest need, and help enhance the quality-of-service Safe Haven is able to provide at both our Shelter and Resource Center. Other partnerships like those focused on housing availability and domestic abuse intervention are long-term collaborations aimed to improve and support a better overall system for victim/survivor services. This advocacy is equally important to Safe Haven's mission to support survivors.

We are grateful for all our community partners, and for what we can accomplish together. Below is a list of some of our direct service provider partners.

Legal

Justice North

provides free legal clinics at our Resource Center twice monthly to assist our clients with their legal needs.

MN Legal Kiosk Project

provides dedicated computers at our Resource Center and our Shelter for clients without access to Wi-Fi and who need to connect to remote court hearings and legal resources confidentially.

PAVSA

facilitates direct referrals of Safe Haven clients to their attorney for unmet legal matters, as well as consultation on cases for our advocates.

Children

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE)

provides parent education to our shelter clients weekly, including childcare so parents can fully participate.

Safety

Safe at Home

is an address confidentiality program, and four Safe Haven advocates are certified application assistants to help our clients safety plan and apply to the program.

Basic Needs

Salvation Army

housing case managers complete housing assessments twice monthly at our Resource Center, streamlining the process and making it safer for our clients to apply.

Second Harvest Northland

provides Safe Haven a monthly food order, as well as administers a food rescue program that funnels donations from Super One and Cub Foods to enrolled agencies like Safe Haven.

Empowerment

Women's Empowerment Group at Duluth Bethel

is facilitated weekly by a Safe Haven advocate for the participants in their addiction treatment program.

St. Louis County Jail

hosts a Safe Haven advocate weekly to facilitate a Women's Empowerment Group for female offenders who choose to participate.

Wellness

Wellness Day

at the Resource Center is a monthly opportunity to provide wrap-around holistic options for survivors to focus on their health. Providers volunteer services in reiki, massage, art therapy, and financial counseling, among other services.

Two Rivers Counseling

provides therapy support weekly at the Resource Center, as part of an 8-session program for our clients.
