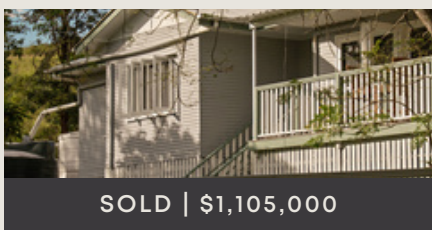

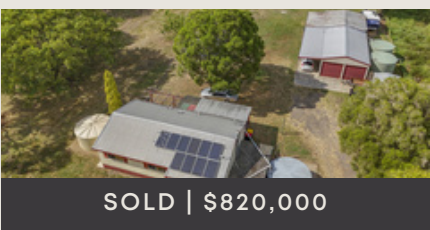

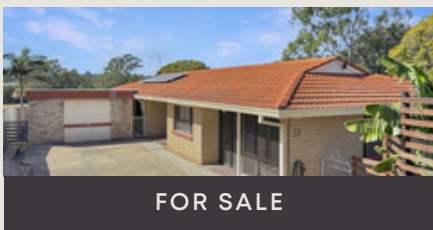

Albanese government abandons inland rail project connecting NSW with Queensland



The Federal Government has significantly scaled back the long-planned Inland Rail project, which was originally designed to connect Melbourne to Brisbane through regional New South Wales and Queensland.

After major cost blowouts—rising from around \$9 billion to more than \$45 billion—and ongoing delays, the project will now stop in central New South Wales instead of continuing into Queensland.

The revised plan will focus on completing the southern section, with funding redirected toward improving existing freight networks and encouraging more goods to be transported by rail and sea.

The decision has drawn criticism, particularly from regional Queensland communities, with concerns around missed economic opportunities, reduced infrastructure investment, and potential impacts on long-term growth in inland areas.

Method	MARS BAR SLICE	Ingredients
Step 1: Grease and line the base and side of a 19 x 29cm slice pan with baking paper, allowing the sides to overhang.		50g Unsalted Butter

Who's been the most helpful since you started?
