▪ **Description and expertise of the team:**

NALED (National Alliance for Local Economic Development) is a non-profit, independent, membership-based organization established in the Republic of Serbia in 2006, with nearly two decades of experience supporting public sector reform, digital transformation, and local economic development in Serbia and the Western Balkans. As the largest public-private association in Serbia NALED gathers more than 330 members (businesses, municipalities, academia and CSOs) and collaborates with over 100 national and international institutions with the mission to create a better business environment and foster sustainable development. The organization collaborates closely with national and local authorities, academic institutions, business associations, SMEs, and international partners to enhance governance, strengthen digital capacities, and promote skills development in line with EU policies and programmes. NALED's Executive Office team has substantial expertise in policy analysis, project coordination, implementation, and evaluation, as well as in the dissemination of results through extensive networks of public and private stakeholders. The team is highly skilled in enhancing digital capacities and implementing digital solutions, including e-Government initiatives and the delivery of electronic services. The team also have strong expertise in data collection and analysis related to local development and skills needs, as well as in the design and organization of trainings, workshops, conferences, and online learning activities.

In addition to its strong track record in public sector reform and digital transformation, NALED brings specific expertise directly aligned with the objectives of the European League of Advanced Digital Skills Academies (ELEVATE), particularly in the areas of coordination, capacity building, multi-stakeholder governance, and market intelligence related to digital skills. This way NALED contributes to strengthening an enabling environment for advanced digital skills development, supporting high-quality training offers, fostering cross-sectoral collaboration, and bridging policy, education, innovation, and practice.

NALED's contribution in the field of advanced digital skills and digital transformation is structured around the following complementary pillars:

1) Evidence-based policy research and analysis for digital transformation

NALED has expertise in conducting evidence-based policy research, designing and implementing analytical tools, and monitoring mechanisms that support evidence-based policymaking in digitalization. A flagship example is the **EU-funded LEI - Local e-Government Index** (<https://lei.rs/>), the first composite tool in Serbia for assessing local governments' readiness for digitalisation across key dimensions such as availability of digital services, data openness, interoperability, information security, and citizen participation. LEI enables systematic identification of gaps, benchmarking, and progress tracking in e-Government development, contributing to transparency, accountability, and improved public service delivery. The tool was formally recognized by the Government of Serbia and integrated into the Programme for eGovernment Development until 2030, ensuring its institutional relevance and sustainability.

2) Capacity building and training delivery for digital skills and e-Government

NALED has extensive experience in designing and delivering targeted capacity building programmes for public administrations, civil society organisations, and other ecosystem actors involved in digital transformation. Within the **LEI** framework, NALED delivered capacity building activities for more than 100 public officials from 47 local self-government units, supporting the adoption of digital public services and the transition towards digital-by-default administration. In parallel, NALED organised trainings and workshops for representatives of 70 civil society organisations focused on e-Government, information security and personal data protection, empowering CSOs and citizens to actively monitor and contribute to the development of digital public services at local level. Building on this experience, NALED will further strengthen its focus on **digital skills development for citizens and civil society in the coming period**, notably through the EU-funded DIGIT – Democratic Innovation for Governance, Inclusion and Transparency project. NALED's activities will prioritize **hands-on, user-oriented trainings** enabling citizens to confidently access and use digital public services, with special attention to **vulnerable and underrepresented groups** (including NEET youth, elderly persons, rural women and persons with disabilities). In parallel, targeted capacity building and support for civil society organisations will strengthen their role as multipliers, supporting citizens in using e-services and contributing to monitoring and improving digital public service delivery.

3) Multi-stakeholder platforms and governance models for digital transformation

A core strength of NALED lies in establishing and managing sustainable multi-stakeholder platforms that bring together government, academia, business, civil society, and international partners. In the area of digitalisation, NALED coordinates the **E-Government Alliance**, a national platform that connects public institutions, ICT companies, experts, and academia to jointly

advance digital public services, interoperability, data-driven governance, and digital skills within the public sector. This experience directly supports the ELEVATE objective of building a sustainable, inclusive governance structure for advanced digital skills academies and initiatives at European level.

4) Bridging digital skills, innovation and practice

NALED actively supports the transformation of knowledge, research outputs, and innovative ideas into practical solutions and scalable initiatives. Through initiatives such as **StarTech** and the **Empower Innovation**, NALED supports startups, innovators, and researchers in applying digital and deep-tech solutions in operational and market-oriented contexts, strengthening links between education, research, industry, and public sector needs. This approach is further reinforced through **Capital Innovation Point Serbia (CIPS)**, which operates as part of the **European Digital Innovation Hub (EDIH) network** and connects local and national actors with the pan-European ecosystem. CIPS provides integrated support to startups, MSMEs and public sector organisations in areas such as artificial intelligence, high-performance computing, cybersecurity and advanced digital skills. In this way, NALED also facilitates knowledge exchange, stakeholder collaboration, and the scaling of innovative solutions across Europe.

5) European networking and integration into EU innovation and skills ecosystems

As the **official EIT Food Hub (2024 – 2025) and EIT Community Hub for Serbia**, NALED plays a key role in connecting local researchers, innovators, startups, and institutions with European Knowledge and Innovation Communities. This positioning enables NALED to contribute to European-level coordination, dissemination, and community-building activities, and to support the integration of national and regional stakeholders into EU-wide digital skills and innovation ecosystems, in line with the League's objectives.
