Healthy Church Growth

We are reminded that, no matter the challenges—whether the need for more space, cultural shifts, or societal pressures—God’s mercy sustains us. Healthy church growth begins with trusting in this faithfulness.

God’s compassion is renewed daily as we gather for worship, study, or service. This truth can inspire us to remain faithful in our mission, even when results are not immediate. Our mission is less about numbers and more about lives touched by the Gospel. Lamentation 3:22

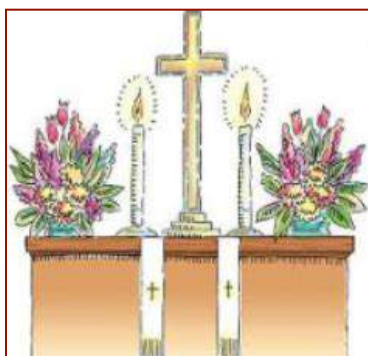

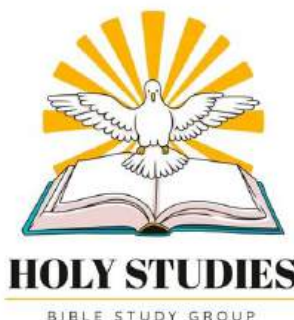

TURTLE TALES or: SAVING THE BOX TURTLE FROM CROSSING THE ROAD

I was on my way to church the day of the June picnic, and since the parking lot was full, I had to park on the grass by the street. It's a good thing it was me who parked there, because I almost ran over a box turtle! Fortunately for her, I always have my eyes open for turtles crossing the road...

I parked the truck and leaped out! To the rescue!

I picked her up, and she promptly pulled her head into her shell and closed it tight.

How did I know it was a girl, you might be thinking? On box turtles, you can tell by their eyes! If the eyes are red or orange, it's a boy, and if the eyes are green, yellow, or brown, then it's a girl! That's only true for box turtles, but for turtles in general, you can tell by looking at the bottom shell, or plastron, which is concave for males, and flat or slightly convex for females.

Box turtles are not called box turtles because they live in a box! In fact, it's illegal to keep them as pets. They are protected wildlife. Of course, if one wanders into your yard or your garden, that's fine, and it's a special blessing!

I estimated her to be 15 to 20 years old, based on counting the rings in the scales on her top shell, or carapace. It's similar to counting tree rings, since turtles also grow faster in the summer than in the winter when they're hibernating.

As I carried the turtle farther back into the woods, she cautiously began to poke her head out, as if she knew I was her friend. I found a mossy spot near a fallen log and some wild blueberry bushes, and gently put her down. Slowly, she extended her head farther out of her protective shell... was it safe to come out?

She surveyed her new surroundings. Then the sturdy legs came out, and she began walking, surprisingly quickly for an iconic slowpoke, as she set off on her journey, probably looking for a suitable location to dig a nest hole. Her distinctively patterned yellow and black shell began to blend in with the dappled sunlight on the forest floor, and soon, she had vanished.... well protected by her own custom built suit of armor, expertly designed by our awesome Creator.

As Saint Paul reminds us in Ephesians 6:11,

"Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil."

Godspeed, Mrs. Turtle! Come visit us again, but please stay away from the road....

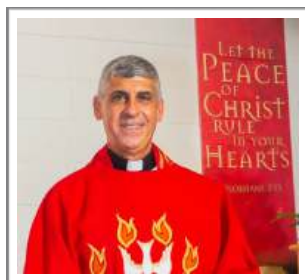
