NULLIFY - PRIVACY POLICY

Nullify Holdings Pty Ltd (ABN 18 664 463 950) (**we**, **us** or **our**), understands that protecting your personal information is important. This Privacy Policy sets out our commitment to protecting the privacy of personal information provided to us, or otherwise collected by us when providing our platform *Nullify* to you, or when otherwise interacting with you (including via our website) (**Services**).

The information we collect

Personal information: is information or an opinion, whether true or not and whether recorded in a material form or not, about an individual who is identified or reasonably identifiable. The types of personal information we may collect about you include:

- Identity Data including first name and last name.
- Contact Data including email address.
- Technical and Usage Data including internet protocol (IP) address, your login data, your browser session, device and network information, statistics on page views and sessions, information about your access and use of our website, including through the use of Internet cookies, your communications with our website, the type of browser you are using, the type of operating system you are using and the domain name of your Internet service provider.
- **Profile Data** including your username and password for Nullify, support requests you have made, and your interests and preferences.

How we collect personal information

We collect personal information in a variety of ways, including:

- **Directly:** We collect personal information which you directly provide to us, including when you register for Nullify, through the 'contact us' form on our website or when you request our assistance via email.
- Indirectly: We may collect personal information which you indirectly provide to us while interacting with us, such as when you use our website, in emails, and in your online enquiries.
- From third parties: We collect personal information from third parties, such as details of your use of our website from our analytics and cookie providers. See the "Cookies" section below for more detail on the use of cookies.
- From publicly available sources: We collect personal data from publicly available resources such as professional networking sites such as LinkedIn.

Why we collect, hold, use and disclose personal information

Our disclosures of personal information to third parties

We may disclose personal information to:

- our employees, contractors and/or related entities;

- professional advisors, bankers, auditors, our insurers and insurance brokers;
- our existing or potential agents or business partners;
- anyone to whom our business or assets (or any part of them) are, or may (in good faith) be, transferred;
- courts, tribunals and regulatory authorities, in the event you fail to pay for goods or services we have provided to you:
- courts, tribunals, regulatory authorities and law enforcement officers, as required or authorised by law, in connection
 with any actual or prospective legal proceedings, or in order to establish, exercise or defend our legal rights;
- any other third parties as required or permitted by law, such as where we receive a subpoena.

Overseas disclosure

We are based in Australia, however some of our third-party service providers are located outside of Australia, including in the United States and other countries. As a result, your personal information may be transferred to, stored, or processed in countries outside of Australia and the European Economic Area (EEA).

For users in the European Economic Area (EEA), United Kingdom, and Switzerland:

When we transfer your personal data outside of the EEA, UK, or Switzerland, we ensure that appropriate safeguards are in place to protect your data, including:

- Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs): We use the European Commission's Standard Contractual Clauses for transfers to third-party service providers in countries without an adequacy decision.
- Adequacy Decisions: Where applicable, we transfer data to countries that the European Commission has determined provide an adequate level of data protection.
- Additional Safeguards: Where required, we implement supplementary measures to ensure the effectiveness of these transfer mechanisms.

- Access: You may request access to the personal information that we hold about you. An administrative fee may be
 payable for the provision of such information. Please note, in some situations, we may be legally permitted to
 withhold access to your personal information. If we cannot provide access to your information, we will advise you as
 soon as reasonably possible and provide you with the reasons for our refusal and any mechanism available to
 complain about the refusal. If we can provide access to your information in another form that still meets your needs,

- then we will take reasonable steps to give you such access.
- Correction: If you believe that any information we hold about you is inaccurate, out of date, incomplete, irrelevant or misleading, please contact us using the details below. We will take reasonable steps to promptly correct any information found to be inaccurate, out of date, incomplete, irrelevant or misleading. Please note, in some situations, we may be legally permitted to not correct your personal information. If we cannot correct your information, we will advise you as soon as reasonably possible and provide you with the reasons for our refusal and any mechanism available to complain about the refusal.

We do not sell personal information. We do not share personal information for cross-context behavioral advertising purposes.

To exercise any of your rights, please contact us using the details below. We may need to verify your identity before processing your request.

Complaints: If you wish to make a complaint, please contact us using the details below and provide us with full details of the complaint. We will promptly investigate your complaint and respond to you, in writing, setting out the outcome of our investigation and the steps we will take in response to your complaint. If you are not satisfied with our response, you also have the right to contact:

- California: California Attorney General

Additional rights for EEA, UK, and Swiss residents

If you are located in the EEA, UK, or Switzerland, you have additional rights under applicable data protection laws, including:

- Right to erasure: You may request that we delete your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Right to restriction: You may request that we restrict the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Right to data portability: You may request a copy of your personal data in a structured, commonly used, and machine-readable format.

If and when you choose to provide our online website with personal information, this information may be linked to the data stored in the cookie.

You can block cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies. However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including essential cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of our website.
