

## **Register Your New Shelter**

Registering your Steadfast Storm Shelters safe room provides important benefits, including product protection, proof of ownership, and access to special updates. You will need the serial number located on the orange sticker inside the shelter.

## **Important Safety Instructions**

Your Steadfast Storm Shelters tornado safe room is professionally engineered and thoroughly tested to meet or exceed FEMA P-320 guidelines for residential and small-business storm shelters. It also complies with National Storm Shelter Association (NSSA) standards and carries their certification seal.

Although the shelter is designed to offer near-absolute protection during EF5 tornadoes and severe wind events, no shelter can guarantee complete safety under all conditions. Proper use of the shelter is essential.

## **Safety Guidelines**

- Do not use AC-powered or high-voltage appliances inside the shelter during storms or when conditions are wet
- Use caution when entering—the floor may be slippery if rain enters while the door is open.
- Always bring a mobile phone with you so you can contact emergency personnel if debris blocks the exit. If you forget your phone, remain inside until the storm fully passes.
- Seek shelter whenever a tornado watch or warning is issued by the National Weather Service.
- Keep essential supplies inside the safe room for comfort and preparedness.
- The shelter is not a toy; children should not use it unsupervised.
- Lock the shelter when it is not in use, but always keep the key in a location that is quick and easy to access during a storm.
- Do not store fuel or any flammable materials inside the shelter.
- Never use open flames—such as candles or matches—inside the shelter.
- Familiarize yourself with the door's operation so you can open or close it quickly in an emergency.
- Do not block the shelter's ventilation openings while it is occupied.
- Only use manufacturer-approved paints or coatings. Other products may release dangerous fumes that could result in serious injury or death.
- Do not try to exit through a door that is partially blocked by debris.
- Inspect the shelter regularly to confirm it remains in safe working condition.
- The shelter is not designed for long-term living or extended occupancy.

## Maintenance

- Clean the interior using a damp cloth and mild dish soap. Rinse and dry thoroughly. Avoid harsh cleaners or solvents, which may cause rust.
- Do not attempt repairs yourself; the shelter contains no user-serviceable parts. For help, contact 334-777-6049.
- Ensure water drains away from the shelter. Excessive water buildup around the structure may cause damage that is not covered under warranty.
