

Register Your Product

Register your Steadfast Storm Shelters tornado safe room to receive important benefits such as product protection, proof of ownership, and special offers. Be sure to have the serial number from the orange sticker inside your shelter.

Important Safety Instructions

Your Steadfast Storm Shelters safe room is professionally engineered and rigorously tested to meet or exceed FEMA P-320 standards for residential and small-business storm shelters. It also meets the standards set by the National Storm Shelter Association (NSSA) and bears its certification seal.

Although the shelter is designed to offer near-absolute protection from EF5 tornadoes and extreme wind events, no shelter can eliminate all risks. Your safety depends on using the shelter according to these guidelines.

Safety Guidelines

- Never use AC-powered devices or high-voltage appliances during storms or when conditions are wet.
- Be cautious when entering—surfaces may be slippery if rainwater enters through an open door.
- Always bring a mobile phone with you in case debris blocks the exit and you need to contact
 emergency responders. If you forget your phone, stay inside until the storm fully passes and conditions
 are safe.
- Use the shelter anytime the National Weather Service issues a tornado watch or warning.
- Store basic emergency supplies inside the safe room for comfort and preparedness.
- Do not allow children to play inside the shelter; it is not a toy.
- Keep the shelter locked when not being used, but keep the key in a spot that you can access quickly during severe weather.
- Do not store fuel or any flammable materials inside the shelter.
- Never use open flames inside the safe room.
- Learn how to properly operate the shelter door so you can open or close it quickly during an emergency.
- Do not block ventilation openings while the shelter is occupied.
- Only use paints or coatings approved by the manufacturer—unapproved products may create harmful fumes that could be dangerous or fatal.
- Do not try to exit through a door that is partially blocked by debris.
- Inspect your shelter regularly to ensure it remains in good working condition.
- The shelter is not intended for long-term stays or residential living.

Maintenance

- Clean the shelter with a damp cloth and mild dish soap. Rinse and dry completely. Avoid using harsh cleaners or solvents, as they can cause rust.
- Do not attempt to repair the shelter yourself—there are no user-serviceable parts. For repair inquiries or operational guidance, call 334-777-6049.
- Ensure water drains away from the shelter. Prolonged water exposure may cause damage that is not covered under the manufacturer's warranty.
