

## **Register Your New Product**

Register your Steadfast Storm Shelters safe room to receive benefits such as product protection, proof of ownership, and access to special offers. Be sure to have the serial number found on the orange sticker inside the shelter.

## **Important Safety Instructions**

Your tornado safe room has been engineered and thoroughly tested to meet or exceed FEMA P-320 standards for safe room construction. It is also built following National Storm Shelter Association (NSSA) guidelines and carries the organization's certification.

Although the shelter provides near-absolute protection during EF5 tornadoes and extreme winds, no shelter can completely remove all risk. Following these guidelines ensures the highest level of safety.

## **Safety Guidelines**

- Do not use AC-powered or high-voltage electrical devices inside the shelter during storms or when surfaces are wet.
- Be careful when entering the shelter—rainwater entering through an open door can create slippery conditions.
- Always bring a mobile phone so you can call emergency responders if debris blocks your exit. If you
  forget your phone, remain inside until conditions are safe.
- Enter the shelter whenever the National Weather Service issues a tornado watch or warning.
- Keep essential supplies inside the safe room for comfort and emergency needs while sheltering.
- The shelter is not a play area—children should not use it unsupervised.
- Keep the safe room locked when not in use, but store the key somewhere easily and quickly accessible during storms.
- Do not store fuel or flammable materials inside the shelter.
- · Never use candles, matches, or any open flame inside the shelter.
- Familiarize yourself with how the door operates so you can open or close it quickly in an emergency.
- Do not cover or block ventilation openings while the shelter is in use.
- Only use manufacturer-approved paints or coatings—other products may release dangerous fumes that could cause serious injury or death.
- Do not attempt to exit if the door is partially blocked or cannot be opened fully due to debris.
- Inspect the shelter regularly to ensure it remains in proper working condition.
- This shelter is not intended for long-term habitation or residential living.

## **Maintenance Instructions**

- To clean the interior, use a damp cloth with mild dish soap; rinse and dry completely. Avoid solvents or harsh cleaners, as they may cause rust.
- Do not try to repair the shelter yourself—there are no user-serviceable parts. Call 334-777-6049 for repair guidance or operational questions.
- Ensure water drains away from the shelter. Excess water against the exterior can cause damage not covered by the manufacturer's warranty.
