How Kensite Supports HolmPatrick Developments with Reliable Welfare That Works

On their current major residential development – a two-year programme delivering a mix of 2, 3 and 4-bedroom homes alongside a large warehouse extension, we supplied and installed a complete modern welfare compound that represented a significant step up from previous site provisions.

Construction Manager Ged Farrington at HolmPatrick said: "The lads love the cabins – they're modern, bright, and fit for purpose. The set-up is a huge step up from what we had before, and Kensite's team have provided a full package solution that just works."

### Designed for modern sites, built to perform

This is a live, complex build requiring facilities that don't just meet compliance standards – they reflect HolmPatrick's commitment to quality.

Welfare matters for teams working on site daily, providing essential space to meet, rest, and manage site activities effectively.

The previous traditional cabins were dated and no longer suited the needs of a modern construction workforce. The challenge was clear for us: deliver welfare that matches the quality of the homes being built.

Our solution included:

- **Modern flat-sided cabins with windows** – creating light, comfortable working environments
- **2+1 toilet facilities** – meeting the needs of the site workforce
- Dedicated canteen and office space – ensuring operational efficiency
- **Secure storage solutions** – protecting tools and materials
- **Weekly waste and water management** – keeping facilities maintained without disruption
- **Flexible provision for evolving needs** – including future drying/drawing room requirements

### Real-world impact: Welfare that makes a difference

From day one, the upgrade to Kensite's modern welfare units created immediate benefits. Bright, well-laid-out spaces provided comfortable environments for meetings and breaks, while reliable weekly servicing ensured smooth day-to-day operations.

The difference between dated, dark traditional cabins and modern, window-fitted units isn't just aesthetic, it's about creating an environment where people want to work.

About the Glassworks

Kensite's products are sat on a piece of local history and significance . . .

The Pilkington Glass Works, St Helens - A Site of National Industrial Significance

The site where new affordable homes are now being built carries extraordinary industrial heritage, having been home to Pilkington Glass – a company founded in 1826 as the St Helens Crown Glass Company.

What began as a partnership between the Pilkington and Greenall families grew to become the largest employer in St Helens, transforming this northwest town into a global centre of glass manufacturing excellence.

The company was always at the forefront of technology, and in 1959 they revolutionised glass production when they invented the float glass process – a technique pioneered at their St Helens production site that gives glass uniform thickness and a very flat surface. This innovation became the world standard for high-quality flat glass manufacture, with float glass recognised as one of the hundred most important inventions of the twentieth century.

For nearly two centuries, the Pilkington name was synonymous with St Helens itself, with generations of local families building their livelihoods on this historic site. The transformation of this former industrial landmark into new homes represents a significant moment in the town's evolution – honouring the site's manufacturing heritage while creating the next chapter in St Helens' story.

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
