


WHERE ROOMS BEGIN

Room Measuring Guide

Accurate room measurements are the foundation of any successful design or layout plan. This quick guide shows you how to sketch your space and record the key dimensions you'll need, ensuring your furniture and ideas fit perfectly the first time.



WHERE ROOMS BEGIN

1. Draw a Simple Floor Plan

Sketch the outline of the room from above.

Mark all corners, alcoves, recesses, chimney breasts, and angled walls.

Label each wall (A, B, C...).

Add doors, windows, radiators, and fixed units.

2. Measure the Walls

Measure every wall from corner to corner.

Write each measurement on your sketch.

Measure ceiling height.

If the room isn't perfectly square, measure width in 2–3 places.

Use cm or mm for accuracy.

3. Measure Doors and Windows

For each one, record:

Width

Height

Distance from the nearest corner

Sill height (floor to bottom of window)

Door swing direction (into or out of the room)

4. Measure Fixed Features

Include anything that cannot move:

Radiators (width, height, depth from wall)

Built-in furniture

Fireplaces

Columns or boxed-in pipework

Electrical sockets, switches, and panels

5. Add Notes & Double-Check

Ensure every wall is labelled and measured.

Check that door and window positions are correct.

Photograph each wall for reference if needed.


Review your sketch at the end for anything missing.

WHERE ROOMS BEGIN


1. DRAW THE SHAPE OF THE ROOM



2. ADD DOORS, WINDOWS, BUILT IN UNITS, CHIMNEY BREASTS ETC..



3. DRAW, LENGTH AND WIDTH OF ROOM IN CM OR MM



4. MEASURE SIZE OF EACH FEATURE
