



## Updated Identification Requirements for Undocumented Colorado Residents

**Effective March 31, 2025**, Senate Bill 24-182 introduces updated requirements for undocumented Colorado residents to obtain identification documents in Colorado.

### What's Changing for These Applicants?

Applicants are no longer required to present:

- Social Security Number (SSN) or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN)
- Proof of Colorado income tax return filing for the immediately preceding year or
- Printed documentation of Colorado residential address for the preceding twenty-four months

### What You Need to Do

#### 1. Gather required documents and ensure you have the following\*:

- a. Completed Colorado Road and Community Safety Act (CO - RCSA) affidavit
- b. One form of identification
  - Passport from your home country
  - Consular card from your home country
  - Military identification card from your home country
- c. One proof of current Colorado residential address

**\*All forms of identification must be unexpired or expired less than 10 years before the date of the applicant's application for a driver license or identification document and must include a photo. All documents must be unaltered certified originals, certified amended originals, or true copies certified by the issuing agency. Photocopies, notarized documents, and online printouts are not accepted.**

#### 2. Schedule an appointment:

- a. New to Colorado? For your first-time issuance of a Colorado credential, schedule an appointment online at [DMV.Colorado.gov/AppointmentScheduling](https://dmv.colorado.gov/AppointmentScheduling).
- b. For renewals, visit [MyDMV.Colorado.gov](https://mydmv.colorado.gov).

### Requisitos actualizados de emisión de documentos para residentes indocumentados de Colorado

**A partir del 31 de marzo de 2025**, el Proyecto de Ley del Senado 24-182 introduce requisitos de emisión de documentos actualizados para que los residentes indocumentados de Colorado obtengan un documento de identificación estándar en Colorado.

#### ¿Qué está cambiando para los solicitantes?

Los solicitantes ya no están obligados a presentar:

- Número de Seguro Social (SSN, por sus siglas en inglés) o Número de Identificación Individual del Contribuyente (ITIN, por sus siglas en inglés)
- Prueba de presentación de la declaración de impuestos sobre la renta de Colorado del año inmediatamente anterior o
- Documentación impresa de la dirección residencial de Colorado durante los últimos veinticuatro meses

#### Lo que necesita hacer

##### 1. Reunir los documentos necesarios y asegurarse de tener lo siguiente\*:

- a. Declaración jurada de la ley de seguridad vial y comunitaria de Colorado (CO - RCSA) completada
- b. Una forma de identificación:
  - Pasaporte de su país de origen
  - Tarjeta consular de su país de origen
  - Documento de identidad militar de su país de origen
- c. Una prueba de dirección residencial actual en Colorado

**\*Todos los tipos de identificación deben estar vigentes o haber caducado hace menos de 10 años antes de la fecha de la solicitud del solicitante para una licencia de conducir o documento de identificación y deben incluir una foto. Todos los documentos deben ser originales certificados sin alteraciones, originales enmiendados certificados o copias verdaderas certificadas por la agencia emisora. No se aceptan fotocopias, documentos notariados ni impresiones en línea.**

##### 2. Agendar una cita:

- a. ¿Nuevo en Colorado? Para la obtención de un credencial de Colorado por primera vez, agenda una cita en línea en [DMV.Colorado.gov/AppointmentScheduling](https://dmv.colorado.gov/AppointmentScheduling).

## **SB24-182 Changes Effective March 31, 2025**

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

**Q: What does SB24-182 do effective March 31, 2025?**

**A:** The Colorado Road and Community Safety Act (SB13-251) allowed Coloradans who are not lawfully present (NLP) or temporarily lawfully present (TLP) in the United States to obtain a standard identification credential as long as they meet all requirements for issuance. Colorado Senate Bill 24-182 amends the issuance requirements for NLP applicants only effective **March 31, 2025**.

**Q: What are the key changes effective March 31, 2025?**

**A:** This legislation eliminates the requirement that the NLP applicant:

- Have filed a Colorado resident income tax return;
- Demonstrate residency in the state for the immediately preceding 2 years; and
- Provide a documented social security number or individual taxpayer identification number.

**Q: Who is impacted by this bill?**

**A:** This bill impacts NLP individuals applying for a standard driver license or state ID. This bill also impacts all Coloradans as it greatly improves the safety of Colorado's roads ensuring that more Coloradans driving on them have passed our state's driver's testing requirements.

**Q: How will this impact the standard license process?**

**A:** Changes effective March 31, 2025 will not impact how driver license office staff handle and verify documentation from an NLP individual applying for a standard driver license or state ID. The legislation will streamline the required documentation for NLP credential issuance by eliminating the requirement for applicants to have filed a Colorado resident income tax return; removing the two-year state residency requirement; and no longer requiring a Social Security number or ITIN for applicants.

**Q: What identification documents can be used to apply for a standard credential after March 31, 2025?**

**A:** There will be no change to the identification, and Colorado residential address documents currently accepted. Applicants will still need to provide:

- A completed CO-RCSA affidavit
- One form of identification
  - Passport from your country of origin
  - Consular card from your country of origin

- Military identification card your country of origin
- One proof of current Colorado residential address

**Q: Will the applicant's information be kept confidential?**

**A:** There is no change to current practice or law around applicant confidentiality. The State of Colorado is committed to protecting the privacy of all applicants.
