#### Curriculum

- At CJCP we strive for academic excellence and prepare students for both college and the workplace.
- We use a year-long schedule with 4 marking periods. Our school operates on a nine-period daily schedule, with each period lasting 46minutes.
- CJCP offers Regular Classes, Honors Classes, Advanced Placement Courses, Dual Enrollment Courses, and Resource Classes.

#### **Graduation Requirements (2025-2026)**

Course Credit Structure (2024–2025 School Year)

During the 2024–2025 academic year, certain courses at Central Jersey College Prep Charter School were scheduled as extended instructional blocks, meeting for two consecutive periods per day with supplemental instruction. As a result, credit allocations for these courses vary by section: some sections earned 5.0 credits, others 7.5 credits, and others 10.0 credits, depending on the total instructional time.

This applies specifically to the following courses:

Algebra I, Geometry, AP Seminar, AP English Language and Composition

Credits were awarded to reflect the extended instructional hours and rigor of the course structure, independent of the standard single-period model.

#### **Earning Credits**

Students can enroll in dual credit courses from Raritan Valley Community College (RVCC), William Paterson University (WPU), and Middlesex County College (MCC), allowing them to earn college credits while still in high school. Additionally, students can accrue credits through CJCP. Students can earn a maximum of 45 credits in a year.

**Note:** Many of our high-achieving students have taken the Algebra 1 course in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade and Geometry and Biology courses in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. These courses will appear under the 9<sup>th</sup> grade section of their high school transcript as pass/fail courses from middle school (MS) providing one credit, but will have no effect on GPA.



#### **Grade Point Average (GPA)**

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. We report weighted GPA on our transcripts. Class rank information is available only upon request. There are two levels of courses utilized for the purpose of calculating weighted grade point average: Advanced Placement (AP) / Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP), and Honors (H) courses.

<u>Principal List and Honor Roll</u> serve as an emblem of excellence to recognize students who excel academically. The lists are prepared at the end of each quarter. They are based on letter grades and include all subjects. The students' who qualify for Principal's List are those with an overall GPA of 4.0 and above GPA. Those who qualify for Honor Roll are those whom have attained a 3.75 – 3.9 GPA.
