»» ISAIAH 54:2

Enlarge the site of your tent, and let your tent curtains be stretched out; ***do not hold back***; lengthen your ropes and ***drive*** your stakes deep.

When Isaiah first spoke these words, the nation of Israel stood on the edge of restoration. After a long season of loss and exile, God was calling His people to prepare for renewal. They had endured years of uncertainty, yet through the prophet Isaiah, God offered a promise of hope. A new day was coming. His blessing would return, His presence would dwell among them again, and their future would be larger than their past.

The image Isaiah used, a tent being stretched and expanded, spoke directly to Israel's heart. In those days, a tent represented the center of family life, the place of gathering and covering. To enlarge the tent was to prepare for growth, to make room for what had not yet arrived. It was an act of faith to build before seeing, to stretch before knowing, and to strengthen before feeling ready.

In this same spirit, God is calling us as a church to prepare our hearts and our house for what He will do next. Just as Israel was invited to expand their boundaries, we are invited to enlarge our capacity for ministry, mission, and faith. "Do not hold back," He says. That means trusting Him enough to step forward, even when the horizon ahead feels uncertain.

Every project within Next, from refreshing our Worship Center to launching a new campus and reaching the world, reflects this same calling. We are lengthening the ropes and driving the stakes deep, not only in our facilities but in our faith.

We are building for people we have not yet met and preparing for lives that will one day be changed by the gospel.

Isaiah's message still echoes today. The people of God were never meant to stay comfortable or contained. We are meant to stretch. We are meant to grow.

As I look across the life of Champion Forest, I am filled with gratitude for how God has moved among us. For more than fifty years, this church has stood as a light in Northwest Houston, a place where people from every walk of life have found hope, purpose, and belonging in Jesus Christ. I am inviting you and your family to join us in this journey, to pray, to participate, and to help propel this mission forward. God is doing something here at Champion Forest, and we are trusting God for all that’s next.



»» OUR HISTORY

Founding and Early Years



1970

On September 20th, Rev. Robin Guess holds the first worship service with six people in attendance.

1972

On October 1, the fellowship formally organizes as Champion Forest Baptist Church with 230 charter members.

1973

On February 25, the church breaks ground on its first worship center and Sunday School building at 12501 Champion Forest Drive.

1976

Members pledge \$400,000 through the “Together We Build” program to fund a new Family Life Center. Construction begins, the first parking lot expansion is completed, and the church Library opens.

1978

Senior Pastor Damon Shook becomes the second Senior Pastor, additional portable space is added, two services begin, and the church is recognized among the top 1 percent in SBC growth.

1979–1982

Facilities are expanded through major remodels and new construction, including updates to the Worship Center, a new 20,000 sq. ft. Education Building, added balcony seating and parking, planning for a new Worship Center and Children’s Building, launch of the “Building Together By Faith” initiative with a groundbreaking in 1981, and additional portable space leased to support growing Sunday School needs.

A Move Toward Greater Impact

1990–1991

A Land Acquisition Committee is formed, resulting in the church purchasing 54 acres at Stuebner Airline and Strack for \$2.27 million, now known as the Champions Campus.

1997–1999

Services begin at the new site while construction continues, Phase II is completed, the church fully relocates to Stuebner Airline, and the former Champion Forest Drive property is sold.

2000–2002

The Champions Campus launches construction of a 4,500-seat Worship Center, Chapel, Library, and expanded infrastructure, culminating in the dedication of the new Worship Center on August 18, 2002.



Reaching for More

2005–2007

Following Pastor Shook’s retirement and the election of a new Pastor Search Committee, Dr. David Fleming is overwhelmingly affirmed as the church’s third Senior Pastor and begins his ministry in January 2007.



2008–2010

The church launches an ambitious expansion plan adding major education facilities and refurbishing existing spaces. Despite economic challenges, the congregation completes the IMPACT initiative and dedicates the new buildings in 2010.

2010

CF embraces multilingual and multicultural ministry, becoming one church in two languages with the launch of the Spanish ministry.



2013

CF becomes a multi-site church with the launch of the North Klein Campus, as 300 church members begin meeting weekly in the Klein Multipurpose Center.

2019

The church celebrates the Easter grand opening of the North Klein Campus on Spring Stuebner Road.



Advancing the Kingdom

2020

Dr. Jarrett Stephens becomes the fourth Senior Pastor, ushering in a renewed focus on evangelism, discipleship, and mission.



2021

The CF Residency is created, expanding as a pipeline for developing future ministry leaders and pastors.

2022

CF Connect is established as a major training and equipping ministry, strengthening the capital “C” Church and leaders across the region, US, and around the world.

2024

New Student Building opened at North Klein Campus.

2021–2025

The church celebrates a historic milestone with 5 consecutive record-setting baptism years, and for the first time sees over 1,000 people baptized in one year.



WHY NOW?

Ministry momentum is building and capacity must grow with it.

- » Facilities are aging and at limits (Champions Campus WC has original carpet, paint, lights & chairs (2002); the last tech upgrade was 2012)
- » North Klein is rapidly expanding, and families and kids need ministry space.
- » Magnolia’s population is exploding, and the opportunity to plant and reach is now.
- » Digital reach is essential for gospel multiplication (Houston, prisons, nations).

WHY US?

- » God has entrusted this generation at Champion Forest with the resources and calling to act now.
- » For over 50 years, this church has stepped forward in faith, and today we stand on the foundation others built.
- » Because Champion Forest has always prioritized people, making an impact, and leaving a legacy of faith.



What is *Next*?

As Pastor Jarrett shared in his opening words, Champion Forest has enjoyed a rich heritage of God’s faithfulness. For more than 50 years, this church has been a light in Northwest Houston, a home where people have found hope, purpose, and belonging in Jesus Christ.

The Next Initiative flows directly out of that legacy. It is our unified “we are ready” to the Lord. Ready to enlarge our capacity. Ready to stretch our faith. Ready to make room for more people to know and follow Jesus.

These projects are not about buildings for their own sake. They are expressions of a deeper desire to build people, shape lives, and prepare the way for what God desires to do in and through our church.

It should come as no surprise that each of our efforts in Next blend seamlessly with our focus priorities as a church. Each part is designed to help us ***advance the Kingdom by making disciples, loving our community, and strengthening the Church.***

The Worship Center renovation at the Champions Campus will support vibrant worship and disciple-making for years to come. The expansion of our digital ministry and broadcast reach will carry the gospel farther into our community and around the world. The new Kids and Adult Discipleship Building at the North Klein Campus will create space for more families to grow in their faith. Our international church planting efforts will extend the mission of Jesus to new cities and nations. And a third campus in the Magnolia area will position us to love and reach one of the fastest-growing regions in our community.

North Klein Campus Expansion — Kids & Adult Discipleship Space and Parking Lot



International Church Planting Projects

Through partnerships with FAMB, Greater Europe Mission, and the International Mission Board, Champion Forest will launch new church plants in Nepal, five European cities, and Madrid—sending people and resources to strengthen the global Church.

“In the DNA of Champion Forest, there has always been a heartbeat for those who do not yet know Christ. We have always “existed for people not yet here.” As we consider what the Next chapter is missionally for us, we are focusing on planting more churches in Nepal, England, Italy, and Spain. New churches reach new people! We want to help FAMB (For All Mankind Movement) reach Nepal. We want to partner with the International Mission Board to establish a Church Planting Residency in Valencia, Spain—replicating what we currently do with Spanish church planting pastors at CF. And we want to plant new churches across parts of Europe with Greater Europe Mission to take the Light back into dark places that once burned bright with the gospel. Taylor grew up in church, but her faith always felt shallow and distant. Chasing love and worth through partying, relationships, and an abusive marriage, she found herself empty, ashamed, and convinced there was no way out. A move to Spring, a sick cat, and a simple Tuesday night gathering at Champion Forest became the turning point where God met her through unexpected people, honest confession, and a message of redemption that changed everything. Today she is serving, leading, and sharing the love she once believed was out of reach.

Jerome and Dora Stovall know what it means to walk through unthinkable loss. Just hours after moving into their new home, their young son Zy'Air drowned in the backyard pool, sending their already fragile blended family into deep grief, anger, and distance from God. Wrestling with hard questions, church hurt, and a marriage hanging by a thread, they eventually found themselves at Champion Forest's North Klein Campus, where the ReEngage marriage ministry and a loving church family became a lifeline. Today, instead of barely holding on, the Stovalls are serving together in Kids Ministry, helping other hurting families discover the hope and healing they found in Christ.

“We knew tithing when there was a paycheck coming every month. The real test came when we celebrated our first anniversary and neither of us had a job.”

Ron and Susie have called Champion Forest home for more than three decades, but their story of generosity started long before they ever walked onto campus. As newlyweds in the mid-80s, they lost both of their jobs and watched the numbers on paper simply not work. Choosing to tithe anyway, they saw God provide in surprising ways and learned that “you really cannot afford not to tithe.”

Now, with children and grandchildren growing up at Champion Forest, Ron and Susie see themselves standing on the shoulders of a faithful generation and joyfully stepping up to become that foundation for the next one. Their story is a quiet, steady reminder that when God is moving, the greatest privilege is to join him.

He is both a longtime member of Champion Forest and a leader with the For All Mankind Movement, a missions organization planting churches in some of the least reached regions of South Asia. In villages across Nepal, he has watched men and women living in deep spiritual darkness hear the name of Jesus for the very first time and respond with surprising boldness, sparking new house churches that are multiplying faster than anyone imagined.

Now, through the Next Initiative, Champion Forest and FAMM are locking arms to fully resource indigenous workers who are ready to risk everything to share Christ with their own people. Every gift fuels training and teams on the ground, so that more and more unreached families can hear the gospel and see churches planted in their villages.

THE COST

The estimated cost of Next is \$38,000,000. This amount of cash and pledges, together with prudent borrowing and cash already on hand, will allow us to move forward.

THE COMPONENTS

Next has two components that work together: “First and Best Offering” and “3-Year Pledge Commitments.” All of our giving is above and beyond regular tithes and offerings.

1. What is the purpose of the Next Initiative?

Next is a churchwide journey of generosity that prepares us for what God is calling Champion Forest to do in the coming years. It strengthens every campus, expands ministry capacity, and positions our church to reach more people with the gospel—locally and globally.

2. How long does Next last?

Next is a three-year initiative beginning on Vision Sunday, January 25, 2026. Gifts may be given at any time during this three-year period.

3. What projects are included in Next?

Next includes:

1. Complete Renovation of the Champions Campus Worship Center
 - New immersive digital audio system with full acoustic treatment
 - New digital video system with upgraded cameras, screens, and infrastructure
 - New theater seating, paint, and carpet
 - Fully redesigned stage optimized for worship and broadcast
 - Complete house-lighting replacement
2. New Adult & Kids Building Expansion at the North Klein Campus

Including a supporting parking lot to accommodate growth and accessibility.
3. A New Campus in the Magnolia Region

Land acquisition.
4. Broadcast Ministry Expansion

Expanding the pulpit ministry of Champion Forest nationally and internationally through global streaming, TV, apps, and digital platforms.
5. International Missions & Church Plants

In partnership with GEM, IMB, and FAMM.

4. Is this replacing my regular giving to the church?

No. Giving to Next is above and beyond regular tithes and offerings, which support the ongoing ministry of Champion Forest.

5. What is Commitment Sunday?

March 1, 2026, is Commitment Sunday! On this day, we are asking our church family to:

1. Bring our FIRST and BEST OFFERING toward Next, with a goal of \$6 million.
2. Bring our 3-year pledge commitment with a goal of \$22 Million.

6. How do three-year commitments work?

Each household prayerfully asks God what they should give over the next three years. Commitments can be fulfilled weekly, monthly, annually, or in any rhythm that fits your financial plan.

7. Can I change or adjust my commitment?

Yes. A commitment reflects faith and intention, not a contract. You may adjust your commitment at any time.

8. Can I give non-cash or asset-based gifts?

Yes. You may give stocks, real estate, retirement distributions, or other assets.

9. What if I cannot attend Commitment Sunday?

You can participate anytime by submitting your commitment online, by mail, or at any campus during the following week.

10. Is any gift amount too small?

No! Every gift matters. Next is about full participation, not equal amounts. We ask each family to prayerfully give in faith.

11. When will the projects begin?

Timelines will align with the strength of our FIRST and BEST Offering and the total amount pledged. Our plan is to begin the Champions Campus Worship Center renovation right after Easter 2026 and the North Klein Campus Building Expansion in August of 2026.

12. How does borrowing fit into the overall plan?

Next includes a strategic borrowing component that allows essential projects to begin rapidly and be completed wisely. Generous giving reduces long-term borrowing.

13. Will Next increase the church’s operating budget?

No. Next funds are separate from regular tithes and offerings. They are designated solely for expansion and improvement projects.

14. Can I participate if I’m new to Champion Forest?

Absolutely. Next is a unifying journey for everyone who calls Champion Forest home.

15. How will I receive updates throughout the three years?

Regular updates will be shared on project progress, financial milestones, and ministry impact. You can also visit next.championforest.org for updates.

16. Can I participate digitally?

Yes. Go to www.next.championforest.org or scan the QR code. You will be directed to select “GIVE NOW,” enter your gift amount, select “Next,” sign in or sign up, follow the prompts to enter your payment information, and submit your payment.

17. Is the 3-year pledge binding?

No. It is a statement of intent made in good faith, but it is not binding.

18. Who will see my gift and pledge?

Only those in our Business Office who need to process the giving information will see your gift and pledge.

19. How do I lead my family well during this opportunity?

This is a unique season of life that may never come our way again, as we invest in the spiritual lives of this generation, future generations, and our region. Be sure to have intentional family discussions and prayer times each week to take full advantage of this moment. Make your First and Best Offering and 3-Year Pledge a family experience.

20. How do I designate my gift to the campaign in the future?

On your check memo line, or on the envelope of a cash gift, writing one of the following phrases: “Next”, “Capital Campaign”, “Pledge”, or any similar designation will let the church know to direct the gift to this campaign.
