**Cultural Dynamics:** The patterns and processes of change and continuity within cultures, influencing societal behaviours and interactions.

**Empirical Data:** Information gathered through observation or experimentation, providing factual evidence for research and analysis.

**Evidence-Based:** Conclusions or insights drawn from systematically collected data, ensuring reliability and validity in research findings.

**Intervention:** Actions or strategies designed to bring about change or improvement within a specific cultural or societal context.

**Misconceptions:** Incorrect or misleading views or opinions, often resulting from a lack of understanding or misinformation.

**Policymakers:** Individuals or groups responsible for creating rules and guidelines that govern societal behaviours and structures.

**Social Norms:** Accepted behaviours or standards within a society or culture, guiding individual and group actions.

**Stereotypes:** Oversimplified and fixed ideas about a group or culture, often leading to prejudiced attitudes and behaviours.
