Project Experience

Hill's Pet Food - Bowling Green, KY

Stewart Richey Site Utilities supported the Hill's Pet Food project through grading and stone placement to prepare the site for concrete work. The scope required coordination between the Site Utilities and Concrete divisions to ensure the area was properly prepared for the next phase of construction. Mark Kinslow led the division's efforts with a focus on site readiness, efficiency, and cross-division coordination.

Menard's Building and Road Extension - Bowling Green, KY

For the Menards building and road extension project, Stewart Richey Site Utilities completed utility work for both the roadway leading to the store and the building itself. The scope included water, sewer, gas, storm drainage, and service utilities, including systems supporting fire protection. The project required careful coordination of underground infrastructure to support the overall site development and building construction schedule.

Teal Drive Phase 1 - Gallatin, TN

Stewart Richey Site Utilities completed grading work for Teal Drive Phase 1, moving approximately 60,000 cubic yards of dirt and rough grading the site for three future buildings. The project required efficient earthwork planning, equipment coordination, and attention to final grade requirements. Mark Kinslow oversaw the division's work to help prepare the site for future commercial development.

Project Aristotle - Portland, TN

Stewart Richey Site Utilities is supporting Project Aristotle through a broad civil scope that includes clearing nearly 20 acres of mature trees, mass grading for the building pad and laydown area, storm installation, retention ponds, and utility infrastructure for the new building. The project requires coordination across multiple phases of site development to support construction progress and long-term site functionality.
