Project Experience

Great Lakes Cheese – Manchester, TN

Stewart Richey Fire Protection completed a large-scale fire protection scope for the Great Lakes Cheese facility in Manchester, TN. The project included more than 25 miles of sprinkler piping throughout the building, along with a fire pump, pre-action systems, rack sprinklers, and 30 risers. Mark Kinslow led the division's work with a focus on coordination, code compliance, and efficient installation across an extensive facility footprint.

Dart Container Warehouse – Horse Cave, KY

For the Dart Container warehouse in Horse Cave, KY, Stewart Richey Fire Protection supported a 600,000 square foot warehouse with an extensive sprinkler piping system. The project included approximately 70,000 linear feet of fire protection piping throughout the facility. Stewart Richey's team coordinated installation across a large warehouse environment while maintaining project progress and fire protection standards.

Embassy Suites – Bowling Green, KY

Stewart Richey Fire Protection provided fire protection systems for the Embassy Suites project, including light hazard protection throughout main areas and residential sprinkler coverage in guest rooms.
