HOLD ONTO ME is the final part of a journey that began with my short films Semele and Aria—each exploring the evolving bond between a father and daughter during preteen and teenage years. This film reaches further inward, tracing the quiet, often unspoken longing that forms in the absence of a father, and the unsettling vulnerability of two people who know of each other, but do not truly know one another.

Reflecting on my own personal experience, it inspires the resilience of a young girl reaching out, and a man who returns with a childlike irresponsibility, unsure how to respond until circumstances force him to face it. The film observes the fragile beginnings of a relationship that never quite had the space to become one, yet allows for brief gestures of care to break through.

As a Cypriot filmmaker, it was important to me to capture the textures of everyday life here: the worn-out backdrops, the slow movement of time, and the raw emotional undercurrents that continue to shape us. This is a story about presence after absence, about seeing and being seen, and the fragile weave of feelings that linger in between. Like the island itself, Iris is small and overlooked—left to endure, until this distant promise of care draws near.



DIRECTOR & WRITER LEAD ACTORS

MYRSINI ARISTIDOU

Myrsini Aristidou is a Cypriot filmmaker whose work has received international acclaim. She studied Film and Art History at Pratt Institute in New York before earning her MFA at NYU's Tisch School of the Arts.

Her short films Semele and Aria premiered at major festivals including Venice, Sundance, Berlinale, and TIFF, with Semele winning the Jury Prize in the Generation section at the Berlinale. Her films have since screened widely and won numerous awards worldwide.

A former Cannes Cinéfondation Resident and alumna of the Sam Spiegel International Film Lab, TIFF Talent Lab, and Berlinale Talents, her debut feature Hold Onto Me marks her transition into feature filmmaking.

Beyond her filmmaking, Myrsini is the founder of the Sagapo Children's Foundation, an international NGO dedicated to empowering underprivileged children through education and creative learning initiatives.



CHRISTOS PASSALIS

Christos Passalis is a Greek actor, director, and playwright born in Thessaloniki in 1978. He studied at the Drama School of the National Theatre of Northern Greece and in 2004 co-founded the Blitz Theatre Group, whose works have toured internationally at venues including Festival d'Avignon, Schaubühne, and Onassis Stegi.

As an actor, he made his screen debut in Yorgos Lanthimos's *Dogtooth*, followed by roles in *Black Field, Homeland, The Miracle of the Sargasso Sea*, and Fiona Tan's *History's Future*.

As a filmmaker, he co-directed *The City and the City* (Berlinale Encounters, 2022) and made his solo feature debut with Silence 6-9, which premiered in competition at the Karlovy Vary International Film Festival.



MARIA PETROVA

Maria Petrova, 11, was born in Cyprus and has Bulgarian roots. *Hold Onto Me* marks her acting debut. Discovered by casting director Daina Papadaki during the search for a non-professional lead, Maria brings raw authenticity and striking emotional depth to the role of Iris.

CINEMATOGRAPHER LASSE ULVEDAL TOLBØLL

Award-winning Danish cinematographer and NYU Tisch graduate, Lasse Ulvedal Tolbøll has shot more than forty short films, including *Knight of Fortune* — nominated for the Academy Award for Best Live Action Short. His feature credits include Sweet Thing (Crystal Bear, Berlinale) and A Gaza Weekend (FIPRESCI Prize, TIFF).

Greek production designer with an MFA from DAMU Academy in Prague, Dimitra has led art departments on MAGMA, 5pm Seaside, and the upcoming Medium, and worked on David Cronenberg's Crimes of the Future. She also collaborates with leading theatre institutions, including the Onassis Stegi.

COMPOSER ALEX WESTON

Alex Weston is a Brooklyn-based composer whose scores have premiered at Sundance, Berlinale, and Venice. His work on *The Farewell* (A24) was shortlisted for the 2020 Academy Awards. Other credits include *The Novice, Goodnight Mommy*, and Amazon's *Expats*. His music blends classical composition with experimental textures, creating emotionally layered soundscapes that elevate narrative storytelling.
