Program Updates

Ethiopia

Fiker Group: Preparing for Graduation & Their Journey

The Fiker Group, our latest group of 25 mothers, is on the verge of graduation, having completed an intensive six-month training program that has transformed not only their skills but their confidence and outlook on life. These women have displayed unwavering determination, resilience, and ambition, proving that given the right opportunities, they can build a better future for themselves and their families.

Throughout the training, they have engaged in hands-on learning, mastering vocational skills such as:

- Spice Preparation: Blending and packaging spices, enabling them to supply local markets and start their own businesses.
- Nail Design: Learning the latest trends and techniques in manicure and pedicure, preparing them for employment in beauty salons or home-based services.

- Hair Styling (Shuruba): Mastering Shuruba, a traditional Ethiopian braided hairstyle widely popular among women, allowing them to offer professional hair services.
- Eco-Friendly Paper Bag Production: Contributing to Ethiopia's sustainability goals by producing eco-friendly paper bags as a viable business venture.
- Sewing Training: Designing and tailoring garments, offering opportunities to work in fashion production or start personal tailoring businesses.

This group has not only gained technical expertise but has also developed business acumen, learning how to market their skills, manage finances, and expand their reach within their communities. The strength and ambition these mothers have shown is nothing short of inspiring. Many of them started with little to no income, and today, they stand ready to become independent entrepreneurs and leaders in their communities.

As we celebrate their achievements, we look forward to seeing them apply their skills in real-world settings, break barriers, and set an example for future groups.



How We Select the Next Group of Mothers

We collaborate with local government offices, different institutions including churches, and individuals to identify eligible beneficiaries based on the following criteria:

Eligibility Criteria

- Single mothers raising at least one child (widows or women without a husband present).
- Vulnerable women facing financial, physical, or psychological hardship.
- Aged 18–45 with at least one child.
- Not receiving support from another organization.
- Financially dependent with no stable income.
- Committed to attending weekly training and income-generating activities.

Selection Process

STEP ONE:

Government Referral

Local authorities provide a list of eligible candidates.

STEP TWO:

Interviews

One-on-one interviews assess suitability.

STEP THREE:

Home Visits

Staff verify the applicant's situation.

STEP FOUR:

Final Selection & Registration

Approved candidates are registered, and personal files are created.

STEP FIVE:

Baseline Assessment

Staff conduct surveys and take official photographs for documentation.

Through this structured process, we ensure our program reaches those most in need, equipping them with the tools for a better future.

Shuruba Training – Preserving Culture, Empowering Women

What is Shuruba?

Deeply rooted in cultural heritage and passed down through generations, Shuruba is a traditional hairstyling method involving intricate braiding and weaving techniques that embody the history, values, and identity of its practitioners, often incorporating diverse braiding methods and embellishments like threads or beads to create visually striking and unique works of art. Serving as powerful symbols of heritage and community pride, specific Shuruba styles can indicate age, status, or lineage and are frequently featured in cultural events, with their creation often being a communal activity that fosters social bonds and the transmission of cultural knowledge. For mothers, learning Shuruba is a vital means of preserving tradition, connecting their children to their cultural identity, and instilling a sense of belonging and pride, ensuring the continuation of this meaningful practice.

Why Shuruba?

1. It is deeply rooted in Ethiopian culture and remains in high demand for special occasions and daily wear.
2. Hairstyling is a flexible, home-based business opportunity, perfect for single mothers balancing work and family.
3. The beauty and fashion industries are embracing traditional African hairstyles, creating even more market potential.
4. By equipping mothers with this skill, we are fostering cultural pride while opening doors to economic empowerment.





Honduras

Tabitha Reach began operations in Honduras in June 2024. Starting with the legalization process and looking for opportunities that would strengthen the beginnings, we established ourselves in a municipal building in the community. Thanks to Mayor José Vicente León, who was interested in supporting single mothers.

On January 14, 2025, we were able to start with the first group of 23 single mothers in the acrylic nail course. Naming the group “Genesis”, which means the beginning of something big. We began by teaching the foundational module, observing the mother’s good receptivity and adaptation to the group.

Tabitha Reach has received support from the community and volunteers who have embraced our mission and vision of the organization.

The organization has been able to connect with people who want to be donors and part of the change that Tabitha Reach wants to bring to Honduras.

Our beginning in Honduras has been filled with gratitude and blessing. For us as part of the operations team it has been a very enriching experience. We have been able to see in each mother the desire to learn and greater awareness of themselves. Feeling supported and capable of changing their reality.

We have also been able to see how the people of our country have come together to make our vision possible. We thank all those who have joined Tabitha Reach as donors or volunteers. As a thank you to our donors in the offices we have drawn a tree of generosity that represents the donations of people that God has placed and will put on the path to bless the organization in different ways. We believe that no one has everything, but everyone has something to give.



Genesis: "The beginning of something great"

Since January 14, 2025, 22 single mothers have been training with the curriculum developed by Tabitha Reach (Foundational, Business, Wellness, Parenting, Civic). It is worth mentioning that in the Foundational part, most of them discovered things that they had kept or hidden inside themselves, caused by episodes lived in most cases in their childhood, and by receiving these lectures they have been able to face these fears and learn how to face them today. They are also learning the skill of acrylic nails, which will open up job opportunities for them when they finish their training.

The Genesis group, most of them between 30-35 years old, is a persevering group, united and there is camaraderie to strengthen the learning, they attend punctually despite the different problems they face daily, they are driven to learn as much as possible to start their own business and thus generate income to improve their environment and the future of their children. The Business sessions have been engaging and transformative for them as it will help them to be more organized, make their own plans and budgets to grow in their businesses or jobs later on.

There is no doubt that we are looking forward to hearing many success stories from this group of single mothers after they complete their Acrylic Nails course.

Plan For the Future

The impact of this initiative extends beyond individual empowerment, fostering significant community growth. Our business development courses have successfully enrolled over 100 mothers, demonstrating the strong interest and need for such programs within the community. Looking ahead, we are exploring opportunities for further expansion, including venturing into jewelry making to provide additional avenues for income generation and skill development. Furthermore, a key focus remains on strengthening our operational capacity, which includes launching a new office to ensure the long-term sustainability and reach of our programs.

Acrylic Nail Design – A Trendy, High-Demand Skill

What is Acrylic Nail Design?

Firmly established within contemporary beauty culture and driven by evolving fashion trends, Acrylic Nail Design is a professional technique for creating artificial nail enhancements. It involves the meticulous combination of a liquid monomer and a powder polymer, which react to form a malleable substance applied over the natural nail or a tip/form. This mixture air-hardens into a durable, strong surface. The practice incorporates diverse application methods and a vast range of design possibilities—from classic polish and gel finishes to intricate hand-painted art, ombre effects, encapsulations, and embellishments like rhinestones or 3D elements—creating visually customized and often striking nail presentations. Serving as powerful symbols of personal style, self-care, and fashion consciousness, specific acrylic nail designs can reflect individual personality, mark special occasions, or align with professional image requirements. While often performed in professional salons, the acquisition of this skill is frequently a dedicated learning process, involving technical training and artistic development.

Why Acrylic Nail Design?

- It is a highly sought-after skill, deeply integrated into the global beauty industry and reflecting current fashion and self-care trends (as seen in places like Honduras).
- Nail artistry offers a flexible, potentially home-based business opportunity, perfect for individuals like single mothers balancing work and family.
- The beauty and fashion industries continually embrace diverse and innovative nail art trends, ensuring long-term demand for skilled nail artists.
- By equipping individuals (particularly mothers) with this skill, we are fostering economic empowerment while promoting creativity, professional confidence, and participation in the contemporary beauty economy.



Success Stories



Terefu's story

Terefu Mamo's journey has been one of resilience, transformation, and newfound hope. Originally from Debre Birhan, she moved to Addis Ababa to live with her sister. Over time, she built a family of her own, legally marrying and becoming the mother of two young children. However, her marriage quickly turned into a painful struggle. Her husband's drinking and difficult behaviour created an environment of instability, leading to emotional distress and hardship for Terefu and her children.

As her health declined and the weight of her challenges grew heavier, Terefu found herself at a breaking point. The stress and anxiety she endured took a visible toll on her; her appearance reflected the emotional toll of her struggles, her face marked by worry and exhaustion. But her story did not end in despair. Through Tabitha Reach's six-month training program, she found the support and guidance she needed to rebuild her life. "Tabitha worked on my mind and changed many things for me," she shares.

With renewed self-awareness and a strong sense of purpose, Terefu started her own small business selling children's clothing and essentials, determined to provide for her family. Today, she is a hardworking mother, filled with hope for the future. Not only has her outlook changed, but her physical transformation is also evident—she looks healthier, happier, and more at peace than when she first joined the program. Her children, once affected by the turmoil at home, are now thriving in school. "God has blessed my children's minds, they are achieving good results in their studies," she says with pride.

At Tabitha Reach, we believe in empowering women like Terefu by equipping them with confidence, skills, and financial independence. Our mission is to help women break free from hardship and step into a life of stability, dignity, and peace; creating a ripple effect that transforms entire families and communities.



Alemnesh's Story

Alemnesh, a single mother and recent graduate of Tabitha Reach's Fikir Group training program in spice-making, is building a brighter future for herself and her child. From the moment she joined the program, her passion and excitement were evident, fuelling her commitment to learning and growth.

Before joining Tabitha Reach, Alemnesh sold small amounts of spices while working as a housemaid. Despite her hard work, her income was barely enough to provide a decent life for her and her daughter. She dreamed of something bigger but lacked the resources and knowledge to expand her business.

Through the training, Alemnesh not only gained technical skills but also experienced a powerful shift in mindset. She began thinking beyond her temporary comfort zone, embracing new opportunities and crafting a vision for a sustainable business. Inspired by the support and encouragement from Tabitha

Reach, she started selling spices alongside her housemaid job, with a goal of turning her side business into a thriving enterprise.

This transformation has not only given Alemnesh financial stability but has also empowered her to invest in her child's health, education, and future. "When I see Alemnesh, I see a woman who once felt lost but now carries big hopes; clever, courageous, and determined to change her life," says Semeret, the Country Director of Tabitha Reach Ethiopia.

Her story has become a source of inspiration for other women in the program, motivating them to pursue their dreams and take bold steps toward financial independence. Alemnesh's journey is a testament to the power of education, determination, and the life-changing impact of support systems that help single mothers overcome challenges and build a better future.

Breaking the Cycle: Stories of Resilience and Empowerment

- Single mothers who receive vocational training can increase their income by up to 50% within the first year.
- Microfinance and small business programs have been proven to lift over 60% of single-mother households out of extreme poverty within five years.


- Access to stable employment not only improves a mother's financial situation but also reduces domestic violence rates and fosters stronger communities.
