This EEA and UK Privacy Notice ("Notice"), together with the Fabric Genomics' ("we," "us," or "our") Privacy Policy, explains how Fabric Genomics' complies with certain privacy rights specifically available to individuals located in the European Economic Area (inclusive of the European Union) ("EEA"), United Kingdom ("UK").

Fabric Genomics, Inc complies with the EU-U.S. Data Privacy Framework (EU-U.S. DPF) and the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF as set forth by the U.S. Department of Commerce. Fabric Genomics, Inc has certified to the U.S. Department of Commerce that it adheres to the EU-U.S. Data Privacy Framework Principles (EU-U.S. DPF Principles) with regard to the processing of personal data received from the European Union in reliance on the EU-U.S. DPF and from the United Kingdom (and Gibraltar) in reliance on the UK Extension to the EU-U.S. DPF. Onward Transfer
