

Preparation of the Gifts

The bread and wine used for the mass are brought to the altar. During the procession with the gifts, we sing:

- 1. O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie!
 Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by.
 Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light;
 The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.
- 2. O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth,
 And praises sing to God the King, and peace to men on earth;
 For Christ is born of Mary; and, gathered all above,
 While mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love.
- 3. How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is given! So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of his heaven; No ear may hear his coming, but in this world of sin, Where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in.
- 4. O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray, Cast out our sin, and enter in, be born in us today! We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel!

At the end of the Preface, all sing:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Memorial Acclamation

After the Consecration, the Priest says or sings:

Priest: The mystery of faith.

All: We proclaim your death O Lord and profess your resurrection

until you come again, until you come again

Communion Rite

Please stand.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name.
Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

The Priest continues, and concludes "as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ":

All: For the kingdom,

the power and the glory are yours

now and for ever.

Communion Procession

During Holy Communion, please either remain kneeling or seated. If you are not Catholic or not receiving Holy Communion for some other reason, we warmly invite you to join in with the procession and ask for a blessing, by crossing your arms in front of you as you approach the altar. After receiving the blessing, respond with "Amen" and return to your seat.

During the Communion Procession, we sing

- 1. Silent night, holy night; all is calm, all is bright Round you virgin mother and Child; Holy Infant, so tender and mild: Sleep in heavenly peace; sleep in heavenly peace.
- 2. Silent night, holy night, shepherds quake at the sight; Glories stream from heaven afar; heavenly hosts sing alleluia; Christ, the Saviour is born; Christ, the Saviour is born.
- 3. Silent night, holy night; Son of God, love's pure light Radiant beams from Thy holy face, with the dawn of redeeming grace, Jesus, Lord, at Thy birth; Jesus, Lord, at Thy birth.

Bow down for the blessing, please answer 'Amen' at the end of each part.

And after the dismissal by the Priest:

All: Thanks be to God.

Recessional
