FATHER MARK WRITES: HABITS, HOLINESS, AND GRACE: THE POWER BEHIND REAL CHANGE

Lasting transformation isn't about sheer willpower—it's about grace. Discover how your daily habits can become sacred steps toward holiness

At the start of a new year, many of us hope for change. We want better lives, to become better versions of ourselves. So, many of us set resolutions—big, bold goals. Yet most fail by February. Why? Because lasting transformation doesn't come from sheer willpower. Willpower is limited; whereas, grace is unlimited.

Instead of heroic resolutions, think about modest habits. Habits aren't about one-time accomplishments—they're about how you live your life. They shape who you are becoming. And here's the truth: God is calling you to holiness, and your habits are one of the primary ways He invites you into that growth.

Paul writes to the Corinthians:

"To the Church of God that is in Corinth, to you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy..." (1 Corinthians 1:2)

Sanctification is God's gift—His own life given to you at Baptism. Holiness is your response: growing into that gift through daily choices. And holiness isn't narrow or rigid. It's not just piety. It's becoming the person God created you to be—physically, intellectually, spiritually, emotionally, socially.

- When you care for your body, you are growing in holiness.
- When you expand your mind or creativity, you are growing in holiness.
- When you pray, reflect, and relate better to others, you are growing in holiness.
- When you handle emotions well or control your temper, you are growing in holiness.

Every small step matters. God is not distant or demanding—He is near and cheering you on. Your heavenly Father is easily pleased but not easily satisfied. He delights in every step forward, yet He longs for you to keep growing. None of us are done yet.

Here's another truth St. Paul gives us:

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks... for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus." (1 Corinthians 1:3–4)

Grace is God's power at work within you. It comes in two ways: sanctifying grace—the gift you received in Baptism—and actual grace—the help you need to live and grow today. Actual grace fuels your habits. It's the strength to keep going when willpower runs out. And you access it simply by asking. God doesn't just call you to holiness and leave you on your own—He supplies the ability to change. Believing that changes everything.

So what do you do this week?

- Choose one habit that aligns with God's will for your life.
- Connect it to your identity and calling: "I'm doing this because I'm God's beloved, called to holiness."
- Ask daily for grace: "Lord, give me the strength beyond my willpower to grow."
- And when you stumble? Offer yourself grace, ask for grace, and start again.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist points to Jesus - the Lamb of God, the source of grace. Through His sacrifice, you are God's beloved child, empowered to live a grace-filled life. Your habits, however ordinary, are sacred opportunities to become who God created you to be.

The reason for habits is not just to accomplish something, but to become someone—holy, whole, and fully alive in Christ.
