FATHER MARK WRITES: SMALL HABITS, SACRED COMMUNITY: WHY WE CAN'T GROW ALONE

Real change doesn't happen in isolation. Discover how simple habits and supportive relationships can help you become the person God created you to be.

At the turn of the year, many of us dream of big change. We picture bold resolutions and super-sized accomplishments. But as we've been saying, real transformation rarely arrives in one grand leap; it comes through small, consistent habits—acorns that grow into oaks, dominos that set off a chain of grace. Habits aren't about one distant achievement; they're about how we live today, shaping who we are becoming in Christ.

A habit, remember, is 'a practice undertaken regularly and routinely with little or no effort of the mind or will... an automatic response.' Over time, the cue → routine → reward loop turns intentions into rhythms, and rhythms into character. But this isn't merely self-help. With God's grace, our habits become pathways toward His purpose—tiny, faithful steps that echo the larger call of discipleship.

In Matthew's Gospel we see Jesus step into public ministry:

"From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" (Matthew 4:17)

'Repent' isn't a scolding word; it's a hopeful invitation: change your mind, change your direction, step forward in faith. Why? Because with Jesus, the kingdom is near—God has intervened in history. If the world has changed in Christ, then our patterns can change too.

Notice how Jesus calls people, not as isolated individuals, but into community:

"As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw... Peter and Andrew... 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' And at once they left their nets and followed him." (Matthew 4:18–20)

He gathers James and John, Peter and Andrew—ordinary workers stepping from obscurity into significance. Jesus also invites us to change through belief and through practical rhythms, supported by a community that keeps us moving. Habits grow stronger when they're shared; they become attractive when the people around us value them. In the right circle, showing up is half the battle won.

That's why small groups matter. They aren't 'another churchy programme,' but places of encouragement, accountability, and grace. Week by week, you sit with others who are trying, failing, and trying again - who remind you of your identity in Christ and cheer the smallest step forward. Our weekend Masses and our weekly small groups are two sides of the same coin: on the weekend, you sit in rows and listen to the Word proclaimed; in small groups, you sit round a table and listen to one another, applying the Word to life.

And there's more: we are cheered on by heaven itself - the angels and the Communion of Saints, our elder siblings who pray for us from the 'heavenly balcony.' Your daily habit may look ordinary, but heaven thinks otherwise. God is near, not distant; He delights in each step, and He supplies the grace when willpower runs thin.

So, what can you do this week?

- Start that one small habit which reflects the person you want to become in Christ.
- Join a small group this Lent - let others encourage, support, and sustain your growth. If you like, use it as a "trial".
- Commit to showing up, asking daily for grace, and beginning again after setbacks.

Simple habits - putting prayer time before screen time, offering a daily compliment, spending ten minutes each day with Scripture, taking a short walk of gratitude - these become sacred rhythms when rooted in your identity as God's beloved, fuelled by grace and strengthened by a community of faith.

Because in the end, the reason for habits is not merely to accomplish something, but to become someone - a disciple formed by grace, joyful in community and steadily growing fully into the image and likeness of Christ.

OUTREACH

Laudato Si: The Earth's temperature has now surpassed 1.5 degrees C of warming compared to "pre-industrial" levels of the late 1800s. This is clearly caused by the widespread use of fossil fuels - coal, oil and gas - in homes, factories and transport systems. When fossil fuels burn, they release greenhouse gases - mostly carbon dioxide (CO₂). This CO₂ acts like a blanket, trapping extra energy and causing the planet to heat up. Remembering the words of caution in Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato si' 10 years ago, let's all do what we can to reduce greenhouse gases and save our world from further temperature rises for the sake of future generations".


