## FATHER MARK WRITES: RETURN AND BE HEALED - LESSONS FROM THE FALL: WHY WE NEED HEALING “WHY WE HURT, AND WHY JESUS HEALS”

*Why do we need healing? Genesis offers a deeper answer than you might expect - and an even deeper hope.*

Last week we began exploring three beautiful, surprising truths about healing: that healing was **central** to Jesus' ministry, that it requires **toughness as well as tenderness**, and that it involves a certain mystery (we must trust rather than control). This week, the Book of Genesis helps us understand why we need healing and why Jesus' healing work is so necessary, so hopeful, and so universal.

Genesis tells us that we were created from the dust with barely credible intimacy:

*“The LORD God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life...” (Genesis 2:7)*

Just take a moment to imagine that tender scene...God did not speak humanity into existence from afar; He **formed** us, lovingly, personally, intimately. Love is the origin of your life, and love is your destiny.

So, God lovingly creates humanity and then he builds the perfect environment for us, a place with no suffering, sickness, disease, shame, or fear. There is only goodness. (c.f. Genesis 2:8-9)

But then comes the serpent, a subtle and crafty beast, planting a question that still echoes today:

*“Did God actually say...?” (Genesis 3:1)*

It begins so gently but it is a cunning tactic, to undermine God. Then Eve in her reply misquotes the command, saying that God had forbidden both eating the fruit and touching it, and suddenly she is sliding toward distrust. This is how wounds often begin: **tiny agreements with the Evil One**, half-truths we swallow without noticing.

We make these same sorts of agreements.

- About others: “Yes, s/he really is impossible...”
- About ourselves: “I’m unlovable... beyond repair... only valued if I perform...”
- About God: “He’s holding something back... He can’t be trusted...”

And these lies wound us. They distort our identity, warp our relationships, and silently shape the way we live and love.

## FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT - SUNDAY 22ND FEBRUARY 2026 | YEAR A

One of the really freeing and healing moments for me 18 months ago was when I prayerfully invited God to show me some of the lies that I had come to believe: lies about myself and lies about God and my relationship with Him. And then I asked Him to replace these lies with truth.

One of the biggest lies was the belief that I knew what was best for the people I love, and that if God didn't act according to my plan, He was letting me, and them, down. The truth I received in exchange for the lie was: "Your Heavenly Father loves the people you love even more than you do." Most days, I believe that truth, although it's a work in progress and there are times when I slip back.

Genesis 3 shows us what happens when humanity chooses pride over trust. The wounds come quickly:

**Physical wounds:** "they knew they were naked" (3:7). The body itself becomes a place of shame, frailty, and illness.

**Spiritual wounds:** "the man and his wife hid themselves" (3:8). We run from God, even though He comes searching, calling out tenderly, "Where are you?" (3:9).

**Inner wounds:** fear, shame, anxiety (3:10).

**Relational wounds:** blame, distance, conflict (3:12).

This first sin is not only the "original sin" — it is also the **original wound**. It shattered human wholeness, and we inherit both the wound and its effects.

Now, I really want you to hear this clearly: **your wounds are not your fault**. They are not your fault, but they are your responsibility. We must choose how we respond to them.

Pride denies our wounds or tries to heal them apart from God, through self-reliance, performance, or even playing the victim. Humility does the opposite: it names the wound honestly and brings it into the light of God's love. Humility opens the heart and lets the Healer set us free.

God is your Healer. Whether through prayer, the sacraments, community, counselling, or medicine, **He is always the One who heals**. And He delights to do so.

This Lent, may we hear again His gentle question "Where are you?" - and take the brave step of answering honestly and returning to Him, our Healer.

Alpha is a great opportunity to invite people to 'come and see' – ask them to just come and try it, without any obligation to commit to anything.

Alpha is more than just a course – it's a journey of discovery. Many people find Alpha to be a turning point in their lives: some encounter faith for the first time, others deepen their relationship with Christ, and everyone is free to explore questions that really matter.

If you know someone who is simply curious, or even just open to the idea that God might be real, Alpha provides a space to explore those thoughts without judgement. 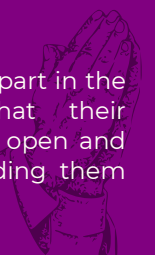
