FATHER MARK WRITES:

FROM THE HEART OF CHRIST TO THE HEART OF THE WORLD

(Extract taken from Portsmouth Diocesan Vocations Newsletter for June)

In June 1675, as St. Margaret Mary Alacoque knelt before the Blessed Sacrament during the Octave of Corpus Christi, Jesus revealed His Divine Heart to her with a poignant message:

"Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love; and in return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude, by their irreverence and sacrileges, and by the coldness and contempt they have for me in this sacrament of love."

This profound encounter connects two of our Church's greatest treasures: the Eucharist (Corpus Christi) and the Sacred Heart. One is the "Sacrament of Love," and the other is the very source of that love. The two devotions - to the Sacred Heart and to the Eucharist - are closely connected. They call upon one another and, we may even say, they require each other. The Sacred Heart explains the mystery of the love of Jesus by which He becomes bread in order to nourish us with His substance, while in the Eucharist we have the real presence of this same Heart, living in our midst. It is wonderful to contemplate the Heart of Jesus as the symbol of His infinite love, but it is even more wonderful to find Him always near us in the Sacrament of the Altar.

Our Lord himself asked St. Margaret Mary to promote both the feast of the Sacred Heart and Eucharistic Adoration, making the connection very clear. It is in the Eucharistic host that we can find the Heart of Jesus, beating and pouring itself out upon us. It is not a coincidence that the feast of the Sacred Heart falls so near to the feast of Corpus Christi, as the celebration of one naturally leads to the other.

A Special Day for Our Priests.

[Neither is it a] coincidence that the Friday after Corpus Christi - the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart - was designated by St. John Paul II as the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. The priesthood was described by St. John Vianney as "the love of the Heart of Jesus." Without the priest, we have no Eucharist; without the Eucharist, we lose our closest connection to the Heart of Christ.

As we celebrate these feasts, we ask you to pray fervently for our priests. Pray that they may be "meek and humble of heart," finding in the Eucharist the strength to consume themselves in service, just as Christ did.

Is He Calling Your Heart?

In His message to St. Margaret Mary, Jesus expressed a particular ache regarding "hearts which are consecrated to Me" that treat Him with coldness. This is a powerful reminder that a vocation is not just a job or a role - it is a response of love for love.

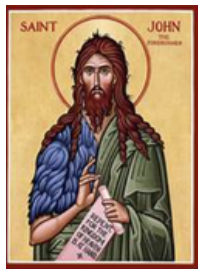

BUILDING WORKS - ST PETER'S CHURCH

PART I

Important Update: Centenary Building Works & Temporary Parking Changes



We are pleased to share that approval has now been granted for external works to the East Window of St Peter's church. The fractured stonework of the tracery will be repaired, and the glass cleaned. This work follows the successful restoration of the church interior and is an important step in preserving this beautiful feature of our church.

When will the work take place?

The works are scheduled to begin during the week commencing **15th June 2026** and, subject to weather and site conditions, may be completed within **one week**. However, the duration is also dependant on what an up-close inspection reveals once the scaffold is in place.

What does this mean for parking?

To enable the work to be carried out safely, a scaffold will be erected at the rear of St Peter's Church in the area currently designated for **Clergy and Organist Parking**.

As a result:

- Clergy and Organist parking spaces will be unavailable while the scaffold is in place.
- Overall parking capacity at St Peter's will be reduced.
- The area will be securely fenced off.
- There will be no through access between St Peter's Church and the Milner Hall via this route.

Please Help Us Keep Access Clear

With parking spaces temporarily reduced, we kindly ask everyone to be especially mindful when parking. It is essential that the turning area remains clear at all times to allow safe access for emergency vehicles, contractors, deliveries, and other site users.

Your cooperation in observing parking restrictions will be greatly appreciated and will help the project run smoothly.

A Request to Parents and Guardians

For safety reasons, we ask parents and guardians to keep a close eye on children during this period and ensure they do not enter the fenced-off work area or attempt to access the scaffolding.

PART II

Centenary Building Works – New Carpets for St Peter's Church

As part of our ongoing Centenary Building Works, we are pleased to share an important update regarding improvements to St Peter's Church.

During the week beginning **22nd June 2026**, the existing carpets in St Peter's Church will be replaced. While the Sanctuary carpet may appear to be in good condition from what is visible to parishioners, it is now over **30 years old** and is showing significant wear in a number of areas. Replacement has therefore become necessary to ensure the safety, appearance and long-term preservation of the church.

The new carpet has been selected in consultation with Historic Churches and, in keeping with the heritage and character of our church, its colour will be very similar to the current carpet. While there was no opportunity to choose a different colour, the new carpeting will provide a fresh and renewed appearance while respecting the historic character of the building.

To prepare for the installation, specialist treatments need to be carried out in both the Church and the Pastoral Centre. As a result, **St Peter's Church will be closed from Monday 22nd June until Friday 26th June 2026 inclusive**.

During this period, **all Masses and other liturgical services will take place in the Milner Hall**. Signage will be available to help direct parishioners and visitors.

The Pastoral Centre will close at lunchtime on Monday 22nd June to allow the necessary preparatory treatments to be undertaken and will **re-open on the morning of Tuesday 23rd June 2026**.

These works form an important part of our commitment to maintaining St Peter's as a welcoming, safe and beautiful place of worship for present and future generations. We appreciate that the temporary closures may cause some inconvenience and thank you for your patience, understanding and support.
