FR MARK WRITES: ASSUMPTION

We celebrate a beautiful feast this weekend, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Rather than focus on our scripture readings, I would like to delve into the "Preface" offered by the Church for today. This prayer gives us a great introduction to the feast, in a sense summarising what we think we are doing as we gather:

*For today the Virgin Mother of God
was assumed into heaven
as the beginning and image
of your Church's coming to perfection
and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people;
rightly you would not allow her
to see the corruption of the tomb
since from her own body she marvellously brought forth
your incarnate Son, the Author of all life.*

Now is the time of God's favour; now is the moment of salvation

The preface begins with the word 'today'. Our understanding of time has been challenged in recent times, not least by developments in modern physics, but liturgical time is the "time" of eternity - God's time. As we celebrate this Solemnity, we are brought into communion with God and, through Him, are connected with the moment of Mary's assumption. We belong to the eternal now of God, where Christ is Lord and time is healed of its brokenness. We are not merely marking an "anniversary" but are participating in a moment of saving grace.

Mary is the Virgin Mother of God

"Virgin Mother of God" - there is a great richness in these four words. "Virgin mother" - this juxtaposition is so familiar to many of us and yet how can this be? How can Mary be a virgin and a mother? This miraculous act of grace, involve in her total assent, is at the heart of the mystery we celebrate today. The title "Mother of God" - *theotokos* - again is so familiar to many of us that we can forget the power of these words. How can it be that a mere human is the Mother of the Eternal God, unless the one Jesus is truly God and truly human? We are reminded again that this feast celebrates a miracle of grace.

Mary is taken into heaven

The feast is called the "Assumption" because Mary is assumed, taken up, body and soul, into heaven. Notice the difference here between Mary's passage to heaven and that of her son. Jesus ascended and Mary was assumed, taken, not by her own power (she is not God) but by the power of God's love.

Where Mary goes first, we hope to follow

Mary is the beginning and image of God's Church coming to perfection. After Jesus, Mary is the first of our human race to be taken into heaven. She is the first member of the Church to "cross the finishing line", to reach perfection in God's heavenly home. She is also the "image" of our future - we can look to Mary in heaven and see a picture of our future destiny. Through faith we too will be transformed into the image and likeness of Jesus and live with him in glory.

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Furthermore, Mary's assumption is a 'sign of sure hope and comfort to God's pilgrim people'. Sometimes the road seems long. We can feel lost, uncertain if we are on the right path. We need signs to reassure us. These signs afford us hope that we are on track - to keep persevering. If that sign also contains a picture to remind us of the beauty of our promised land then this can bring us comfort and consolation. Even if now we are caught up in fog or rain, thunder or darkness, unbearable cold, unimaginable heat, we are heading for a place where all will be well, where we discover that proverbial warm supper and a bath awaiting us in a place where there is no more sadness, no more tears, no more pain.

Pope Pius XII, when he was defining the dogma of the Assumption, said this:

"And so we may hope that those who meditate upon the glorious example Mary offers us may be more and more convinced of the value of a human life entirely devoted to carrying out the heavenly Father's will and to bringing good to others... Finally it is our hope that belief in Mary's bodily Assumption into heaven will make our belief in our own resurrection stronger and render it more effective."

Centenary Walking Pilgrimage Across the Parish – Saturday 19th Sept – Stockbridge to Alresford via Winchester

Here is a [link to the form for the Centenary Pilgrimage Walk](#) across the Parish of St. Peter and the Winchester Martyrs on Saturday 19th September.

We will gather at St. Thomas More, Stockbridge at 6:30am, ready to begin walking at 7am, calling at St. Stephen's (about 11 miles, arrive approx midday) and then on to St. Peter's (another 4 miles, arrive approx 1:40pm) and then finally on to St. Gregory the Great, Alresford (another 10 miles, arrive just after 6pm). There will be a brief (approx 30 minute) pause in each church for some prayers, some light refreshments and a chance to use the facilities. (NB public toilets will be few and far between along the route!)

You are welcome to join us for all or part of the walk and you will need to be sufficiently physically fit to walk at a reasonable pace (average 3mph) for the distance you sign up for.

Under 18s may join us, but only if accompanied by an adult, who is totally responsible for them and must keep them in line of sight at all times.

MP VISITS ST PETER'S SANCTUARY WELCOME HUB

On 12th August, Danny Chambers MP and his Executive Assistant, Hayley, visited The Hub to meet guests and volunteers and experience first-hand the warm community that gathers each week. After enjoying a bacon butty prepared by Hilary, Danny spent time listening to people's stories and learning more about life at The Hub.

A highlight of the visit was a frank and thoughtful discussion with five guests seeking asylum. They shared the challenges they face, including lengthy delays in decision-making, restrictions on working, travel requirements to submit evidence, and concerns about recent changes to refugee status and asylum support. The conversation also touched on hate crime and the increasingly divisive public debate surrounding asylum. Yet the strongest message was one of gratitude and belonging.

Without exception, guests spoke warmly of Winchester, describing the kindness and welcome they have received. They particularly valued Wednesday mornings at The Hub, football sessions and other activities, and expressed heartfelt thanks to St Peter's and the Southampton & Winchester Visitors Group (SWVG) for helping them feel at home. The visit concluded with Annabel speaking eloquently about teaching English, describing it as both an honour and a privilege to support our guests as they build confidence, skills and friendships.

The visit was a powerful reminder that behind every asylum application is a person with a story, and that welcome, friendship and community can make a lasting difference.
